SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to transportation.

AN ACT relating to transportation; authorizing the Department of Transportation to enter into a public-private partnership to plan, design, construct, improve, finance, operate and maintain an eligible transportation facility; authorizing the Board of Directors of the Department of Transportation to establish user fees, administrative fines and other penalties and charges relating to the use of such a facility; making provisions regarding taxation of leasehold interests, possessory interests, beneficial interests and beneficial use of exempt property inapplicable to property used by a public-private partnership; requiring the Department of Motor Vehicles to place a hold on the renewal of the registration of a motor vehicle of a registered owner who fails to pay such a user fee; authorizing the Department of Motor Vehicles to establish certain administrative fees; revising provisions governing design-build projects of the Department of Transportation; authorizing the Department of Transportation to approve, upon request, the construction of a toll bridge or toll road by a person; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Section 12 of this bill authorizes the Department of Transportation to enter into one or more public-private partnerships for planning, designing, financing, constructing, improving, maintaining, operating or acquiring rights-of-way for certain transportation facilities. **Section 19** of this bill authorizes the Board of Directors of the Department to establish: (1) a schedule or methodology for charging user fees for the use of such a facility; and (2) administrative fines and other penalties and charges for nonpayment of user fees. **Section 19** also authorizes the Board to approve exemptions from the user fees for certain motor vehicles. **Section 22** of this bill provides administrative fines, late charges and other penalties and charges for failure to pay a required user fee. **Section 23** of this bill requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to place a hold on the renewal of the registration of a motor vehicle if the Department of Transportation or a private partner provides notice to the Department of Motor Vehicles that the registered owner of the motor vehicle has failed to pay a required user fee.

Section 25 of this bill requires that all money received and is to be retained by the Department of Transportation in connection with a transportation facility that is derived from the imposition of any charge with respect to the operation of any motor vehicle upon any public highway in Nevada be deposited in the State Highway Fund, accounted for separately and, except for costs of administration, be used exclusively for the design, construction, operation, maintenance, financing and repair of the public highways of Nevada. In addition, **section 25** requires that the money received by the Department from the eligible transportation facility first be used to defray the costs of administration, design, construction, operation, maintenance, financing and repair of the transportation facility. **Section 26** of this bill authorizes certain financing of a transportation facility. **Section 29** of this bill requires a private partner to pay prevailing wages for facility construction. **Section 30** of this bill authorizes the Department to adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of this bill. **Section 31** of this bill requires the Board of Directors to submit a report concerning any transportation facilities completed to the Legislative Commission on or before February 1 of each even-numbered year and to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Legislature on or before February 1 of each odd-numbered year.

Under existing law, the Department is authorized to enter into contracts with a design-build team to design and construct highway projects for which the estimated cost exceeds \$20 million and which meet certain conditions. Once each fiscal year, the Department is authorized to contract with a design-build team for a project the estimated cost of which is at least \$5 million but less than \$20 million. (NRS 408.388) **Section 38** of this bill removes the monetary thresholds that limit the number of projects of the Department that may be constructed pursuant to the design-build method and, therefore, allows the Department to contract with a design-build team for any highway project if the conditions set forth in existing law are met.

A design-build team that submits a final proposal to the Department on a project is required under existing law to submit, as part of the proposal, certain information about the subcontractors who will provide a portion of the work on the project. (NRS 408.3886) **Section 39** of this bill eliminates the requirement that a design-build team provide this information regarding subcontractors.

Upon request, the Department is allowed under existing law to authorize a person to develop, construct, improve, maintain or operate certain transportation projects except a toll bridge or toll road. (NRS 408.5471, 408.5473) **Section 40** of this bill eliminates the exclusion of toll bridges and toll roads and, therefore, allows the Department to approve requests or proposals for toll bridge and toll road projects.



1 WHEREAS, The Legislature finds that the State of Nevada is
2 faced with growing traffic congestion and the limited ability to
3 expand freeway capacity because of financial, environmental and
4 physical constraints; and

5 WHEREAS, The Legislature finds that it is beneficial to evaluate
6 alternative approaches to managing the use of existing and planned
7 transportation facilities; and

8 WHEREAS, The Legislature finds that public-private partnerships
9 have been demonstrated to be an effective means of providing
10 motorists with more reliable travel opportunities and more choices
11 within congested freeway corridors; and

12 WHEREAS, The Legislature finds that public-private partnerships
13 are an effective means of financing the development, operation and
14 maintenance of a transportation facility; and

15 WHEREAS, It is the intent of the Legislature to maximize the
16 effectiveness and efficiency of the State's highway system; and

17 WHEREAS, It is the intent of the Legislature to authorize the
18 Department of Transportation to establish and carry out
19 transportation facilities to increase highway efficiency, enhance
20 mobility, improve the effectiveness of transit, and facilitate the
21 feasibility of financing improvements through user fees and public-
22 private partnerships; now, therefore,

24 THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
25 SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:
26

27 **Section 1.** Chapter 408 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
28 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 32, inclusive, of this
29 act.

30 **Sec. 2.** *As used in sections 2 to 32, inclusive, of this act,*
31 *unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined*
32 *in sections 3 to 11, inclusive, of this act have the meanings*
33 *ascribed to them in those sections.*

34 **Sec. 3.** *"Authorized emergency vehicle" has the meaning*
35 *ascribed to it in NRS 484A.020.*

36 **Sec. 4.** *"Concession" means any lease, ground lease,*
37 *franchise, easement, permit, right of entry, operating agreement or*
38 *other binding agreement transferring rights for the use or control,*
39 *in whole or in part, of an eligible transportation facility by the*
40 *Department to a private partner.*

41 **Sec. 5. 1.** *"Eligible transportation facility" means a facility,*
42 *including an enhanced, improved, expanded, extended, upgraded*
43 *or new facility, used or useful for the safe transport of people or*



1 goods via one or more modes of transport, whether involving
2 highways, railways, airports, monorails, transit, bus systems,
3 guided rapid transit, fixed guideways, ferries, vessels, intermodal
4 or multimodal systems or any other mode of transport, as well as
5 facilities, structures, parking, rest areas, maintenance yards, rail
6 yards or storage facilities, vehicles, rolling stock or other related
7 equipment, items or property.

8 2. The term includes, without limitation, highways, roads,
9 bridges, on-ramps, off-ramps, direct connectors to or from other
10 highways or arterials, tunnels, connectors to an airport, pavement,
11 shoulders, structures, culverts, curbs, toll gantries and systems,
12 drains, rights-of-way, buildings, communication facilities,
13 equipment appurtenances, lighting, signage, service centers,
14 operations centers, rest areas, services, personal property and
15 works incidental to, related to or desirable for highway design,
16 construction, improvement, operation or maintenance.

17 Sec. 6. "Managed lanes" means a highway facility or a set of
18 lanes in which operational and traffic management strategies,
19 including, without limitation, access control, vehicle eligibility and
20 pricing, are implemented and managed in response to changing
21 conditions, traffic and usage and which may include the
22 assessment of a user fee. The term includes, without limitation,
23 express lanes.

24 Sec. 7. "Motor vehicle" has the meaning ascribed to it in
25 NRS 484A.130.

26 Sec. 8. "Private partner" means a person with whom the
27 Department enters into a public-private partnership.

28 Sec. 9. "Public-private partnership" means a contract
29 entered into by the Department with a private partner under which
30 the private partner:

31 1. Assists the Department in defining a potential project
32 concerning an eligible transportation facility and negotiates terms
33 for potentially carrying out the planning, designing, financing,
34 constructing, improving, maintaining, operating or acquiring
35 rights-of-way for, or any combination thereof, the eligible
36 transportation facility, or any portion thereof; or

37 2. Assumes responsibility for planning, designing, financing,
38 constructing, improving, maintaining, operating or acquiring
39 rights-of-way for, or any combination thereof, an eligible
40 transportation facility, or any portion thereof.

41 Sec. 10. "Registered owner" means a person whose name
42 appears in the records of the Department of Motor Vehicles as the
43 person to whom a motor vehicle is registered.

44 Sec. 11. "User fee" means a fee, toll, fare or other similar
45 charge, including, without limitation, any incidental, account



1 *maintenance, administrative, credit card or video tolling fee or*
2 *charge authorized by a public-private partnership and imposed on*
3 *a person for his or her use of an eligible transportation facility.*

4 **Sec. 12.** 1. *The Department, subject to the approval of the*
5 *Board, may enter into a public-private partnership to plan,*
6 *finance, design, construct, improve, maintain, operate or acquire*
7 *the rights-of-way for, or any combination thereof, an eligible*
8 *transportation facility.*

9 2. *A public-private partnership may include, without*
10 *limitation:*

11 (a) *A predevelopment agreement leading to another*
12 *implementing agreement that is described in this subsection;*

13 (b) *A design-build agreement;*

14 (c) *A design-build agreement that includes the financing,*
15 *maintenance or operation, or any combination thereof, of the*
16 *eligible transportation facility;*

17 (d) *A concession;*

18 (e) *A construction agreement that includes the financing,*
19 *maintenance or operation, or any combination thereof, of the*
20 *eligible transportation facility;*

21 (f) *An agreement for the operation and maintenance of the*
22 *eligible transportation facility;*

23 (g) *Any other method or agreement for completion of the*
24 *eligible transportation facility, or any combination thereof, that*
25 *the Department determines will serve the public interest; or*

26 (h) *Any combination of paragraphs (a) to (g), inclusive.*

27 3. *Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4,*
28 *notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a public-private*
29 *partnership may be for a term of not more than 55 years after:*

30 (a) *The opening of the eligible transportation facility to the*
31 *public and the commencement of its full operations and collection*
32 *of revenue, if the public-private partnership involves an eligible*
33 *transportation facility that charges user fees;*

34 (b) *The opening of the eligible transportation facility and the*
35 *commencement of its full operations; or*

36 (c) *The commencement of the public-private partnership, if the*
37 *public-private partnership involves a facility or service that is not*
38 *generally open to or used by the public.*

39 4. *A public-private partnership may be extended:*

40 (a) *As a result of an event in the nature of force majeure;*

41 (b) *As a means to compensate the private partner for events set*
42 *forth in the public-private partnership that entitle the private*
43 *partner to compensation; or*

44 (c) *For additional terms upon the mutual agreement of the*
45 *private partner and the Department, as authorized by the Board.*



1 5. *An eligible transportation facility must be owned by the*
2 *Department and remain:*

3 (a) *A public highway;*

4 (b) *A public use; and*

5 (c) *A public facility.*

6 **Sec. 13.** *The Department may do such things as are*
7 *necessary and appropriate to carry out a public-private*
8 *partnership entered into pursuant to section 12 of this act,*
9 *including, without limitation:*

10 1. *Retain legal, financial, technical and other consultants to*
11 *assist the Department concerning the eligible transportation*
12 *facility.*

13 2. *Apply for, accept and expend money from any lawful*
14 *source, including, without limitation, any public or private*
15 *funding, loan, grant, line of credit, loan guarantee, credit*
16 *instrument, private activity bond allocation, credit assistance from*
17 *the Federal Government or other type of assistance that is*
18 *available to carry out the eligible transportation facility.*

19 3. *Accept from any source any grant, donation, gift or other*
20 *form of conveyance of land, money, other real or personal*
21 *property or other thing of value made to the Department to carry*
22 *out the eligible transportation facility.*

23 4. *Enter into a bond indenture, loan agreement, interest rate*
24 *swap, hedge agreement, financing agreement, security agreement,*
25 *pledge agreement, credit facility, trust agreement or other*
26 *financial agreement in connection with the financing of the*
27 *eligible transportation facility pursuant to sections 2 to 32,*
28 *inclusive, of this act.*

29 **Sec. 14.** 1. *To enter into a public-private partnership with*
30 *the Department pursuant to section 12 of this act, a person must:*

31 (a) *Obtain a performance bond, payment bond, letter of credit,*
32 *parent company guarantee or other security acceptable to the*
33 *Department, or any combination thereof, in amounts determined*
34 *by the Department;*

35 (b) *Obtain insurance covering general liability and liability for*
36 *errors and omissions in amounts determined by the Department;*

37 (c) *Not have been found liable for breach of contract with*
38 *respect to a previous project with the Department, other than a*
39 *breach for legitimate cause, during the 5 years immediately*
40 *preceding the date of commencement of the solicitation of the*
41 *public-private partnership; and*

42 (d) *Not be disqualified from being awarded a contract*
43 *pursuant to NRS 338.017, 338.13895, 338.1475 or 408.333.*

44 2. *A private partner is not required to hold the licenses and*
45 *certifications required to undertake the work for the eligible*



1 *transportation facility as a condition of eligibility to be a private*
2 *partner, but must ensure that any work which requires a license or*
3 *certification is performed by a person that possesses the required*
4 *license or certification.*

5 3. *Any private entity that wishes to enter into a public-private*
6 *partnership pursuant to section 12 of this act must provide*
7 *satisfactory evidence to the Board that the entity is in compliance*
8 *with the requirements of title 7 of NRS.*

9 **Sec. 15.** 1. *A public-private partnership entered into*
10 *pursuant to section 12 of this act must be awarded through one or*
11 *more solicitations. The Department may solicit a public-private*
12 *partnership through a process involving:*

13 (a) *A request for statements of qualifications and a request for*
14 *proposals; or*

15 (b) *A request for proposals.*

16 2. *If a request for qualifications is issued by the Department,*
17 *the Department may select a certain number of persons who*
18 *submitted a statement of qualifications to receive and respond to a*
19 *request for proposals.*

20 3. *For any solicitation in which the Department issues a*
21 *request for statements of qualifications, request for proposals or*
22 *similar request, the Department may determine the method of*
23 *evaluation and which factors the Department will consider, and*
24 *the relative weight of those factors, in the evaluation process to*
25 *obtain the best value for the Department, including, without*
26 *limitation, such factors as qualifications, experience, cost, price,*
27 *financial plan, financial commitment, innovative financing and*
28 *technology, technical approach and management approach. The*
29 *Department shall set forth in the request for statements of*
30 *qualifications, request for proposals or other request, as*
31 *applicable, the methodology, the factors that will be used, and the*
32 *relative weight of those factors, for the evaluation process.*

33 4. *Each request for proposals issued for an eligible*
34 *transportation facility must require each person submitting a*
35 *proposal to include with the proposal an executive summary. The*
36 *executive summary must address the major elements of the*
37 *proposal but must not include the financial terms of the proposal,*
38 *the financing plan or other confidential or proprietary*
39 *information or trade secrets that the person submitting the*
40 *proposal intends to be exempt from disclosure.*

41 5. *The executive summary may be released to the public by*
42 *the Department at any time.*

43 6. *After evaluation of the proposals submitted in response to*
44 *a request for proposals, the Department shall enter into*
45 *negotiations with the applicant whose proposal appeared to have*



1 *the best value to enter into a public-private partnership. If the*
2 *Department is unable to negotiate a public-private partnership*
3 *with that applicant upon such terms and conditions that the*
4 *Department determines to be in the best interest of the public, the*
5 *Department shall suspend or terminate negotiations with that*
6 *applicant. The Department may then undertake negotiations with*
7 *the next highest-ranked applicant in sequence until a public-*
8 *private partnership is entered into or a determination is made by*
9 *the Department to reject all applicants that submitted proposals.*

10 7. *After the award and execution of the public-private*
11 *partnership, the Department shall make available to the applicants*
12 *and the public the results of the evaluations of proposals and the*
13 *final rankings of the applicants.*

14 8. *Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, to*
15 *maximize competition and to obtain the best value for the public,*
16 *no part of a proposal other than the executive summary may be*
17 *released or disclosed by the Department before the award and*
18 *execution of the public-private partnership and the conclusion of*
19 *any specified period to protest or otherwise challenge the award,*
20 *except pursuant to an administrative or judicial order requiring*
21 *release or disclosure of any part of the proposal.*

22 **Sec. 16.** 1. *The Department may reimburse a person who*
23 *submitted a proposal but with whom the Department did not enter*
24 *into a public-private partnership for a portion of the cost of*
25 *preparing the proposal or best and final offer, or both, if*
26 *the Department determines that the proposal was responsive to the*
27 *request for proposals and met all the requirements set by the*
28 *Department for the eligible transportation facility.*

29 2. *If the Department intends to make such a reimbursement,*
30 *the Department shall set forth the terms, conditions and estimated*
31 *amount of the reimbursement in the request for qualifications or*
32 *in the request for proposals, as applicable, for the eligible*
33 *transportation facility.*

34 3. *In exchange for the reimbursement, the Department shall*
35 *require the recipient to grant to the Department the nonexclusive*
36 *right to use any work product contained in the proposal,*
37 *including, without limitation, technologies, techniques, methods,*
38 *processes and information contained in the design. Such use by*
39 *the Department is at the sole risk of the Department, and the*
40 *recipient does not have any responsibility for such use.*

41 **Sec. 17.** 1. *Except as otherwise provided in this subsection,*
42 *information obtained by or disclosed to the Department during the*
43 *procurement or negotiation of a public-private partnership may be*
44 *kept confidential until the public-private partnership is executed.*
45 *The Department may exempt from release to the public any*



1 *confidential or proprietary information obtained by or disclosed to*
2 *the Department during the procurement or negotiation.*

3 2. *To make confidential and proprietary information exempt*
4 *from disclosure pursuant to subsection 1, the person who submits*
5 *a proposal or other response to a solicitation for an eligible*
6 *transportation facility must:*

7 (a) *Invoke the request for exclusion upon submission of the*
8 *information or other materials for which protection is sought;*

9 (b) *Identify the data or other materials for which protection is*
10 *sought with conspicuous labeling;*

11 (c) *State the reasons why protection is necessary for each*
12 *document for which protection is sought;*

13 (d) *Fully comply with any applicable state law with respect to*
14 *information that the person contends should be exempt from*
15 *disclosure; and*

16 (e) *Defend any action seeking release of records that the*
17 *person submitting the proposal or response believes are protected*
18 *from disclosure, and indemnify, defend and hold harmless the*
19 *State, the Department, its agents and its employees from any*
20 *judgments awarded against the State or the Department in favor of*
21 *the party requesting the records, including any and all costs*
22 *connected with that defense. Under no circumstances will the*
23 *Department be responsible or liable to the person submitting the*
24 *proposal or response or any other person for the disclosure of any*
25 *such labeled materials, whether the disclosure is required by law*
26 *or court order or occurs through inadvertence, mistake or*
27 *negligence on the part of the Department or its officers,*
28 *employees, contractors or consultants.*

29 **Sec. 18.** 1. *A public-private partnership entered into*
30 *pursuant to section 12 of this act may include provisions that:*

31 (a) *Authorize the Department and the private partner to*
32 *charge, collect, use, enforce and retain user fees, including,*
33 *without limitation, provisions that:*

34 (1) *Specify the technology to be used in the eligible*
35 *transportation facility;*

36 (2) *Establish circumstances under which the Department*
37 *may receive the revenues or a share of the revenues from such*
38 *user fees; and*

39 (3) *State that the user fees may be collected directly by the*
40 *Department, the private partner or by a third party engaged for*
41 *that purpose.*

42 (4) *Prescribe a formula, indexation or mechanism for the*
43 *adjustment of user fees during the term of the public-private*
44 *partnership.*



1 (5) *Allow a variety of strategies to be employed to manage*
2 *traffic on the eligible transportation facility, including, without*
3 *limitation:*

4 (I) *High-occupancy vehicle lanes where single- or*
5 *low-occupancy vehicles may use higher-occupancy vehicle lanes*
6 *by paying a toll.*

7 (II) *Managed lanes or facilities in which the tolls may*
8 *vary during the course of the day or week or according to the*
9 *levels of congestion that are anticipated or experienced.*

10 (III) *Any combination of, or variation on, the*
11 *strategies set forth in sub-subparagraphs (I) and (II), or any other*
12 *strategy that the Department determines is appropriate based on*
13 *the specific circumstances of the eligible transportation facility.*

14 (6) *Govern the enforcement of user fees, including,*
15 *without limitation, provisions for the use of cameras or other*
16 *mechanisms to ensure that users have paid user fees which are*
17 *due and provisions that allow the Department of Transportation*
18 *and private partner access to relevant databases, including,*
19 *without limitation, databases of the Department of Motor*
20 *Vehicles, for enforcement purposes. The Department of*
21 *Transportation may impose a civil penalty of not more than*
22 *\$10,000 per violation for misuse of the data contained in such*
23 *databases, including, without limitation, negligence in securing*
24 *the data properly. Any civil penalty collected pursuant to this*
25 *subparagraph must be deposited in the State General Fund.*

26 (b) *Allow for payments to be made by this State to the private*
27 *partner, including, without limitation, periodic payments,*
28 *construction payments, payments for attaining milestones,*
29 *progress payments, payments based on availability or other*
30 *performance-based payments, payments relating to events for*
31 *which the public-private partnership requires payment of*
32 *compensation and payments relating to or arising out of the*
33 *termination of the public-private partnership.*

34 (c) *Allow the Department to accept payments of money from,*
35 *and share revenues with, the private partner. The Department*
36 *shall deposit such money in the State Highway Fund.*

37 (d) *Address the manner in which the Department and the*
38 *private partner will share management of the risks of the eligible*
39 *transportation facility.*

40 (e) *Specify the manner in which the Department and the*
41 *private partner will share the costs of any development of the*
42 *eligible transportation facility.*

43 (f) *Allocate financial responsibility for any costs that exceed*
44 *the amount specified in the public-private partnership.*



1 (g) Establish applicable liquidated or stipulated damages to
2 be assessed for nonperformance by the private partner.

3 (h) Establish performance criteria or incentives, or both.

4 (i) Address the acquisition of rights-of-way and other
5 property interests that may be required for the eligible
6 transportation facility, including, without limitation, provisions
7 that address the exercise of eminent domain by the Department in
8 the manner authorized pursuant to chapters 37 and 408 of NRS.

9 (j) Establish recordkeeping, accounting and auditing
10 standards to be used for the project.

11 (k) Upon termination of the public-private partnership,
12 address responsibility for repair, rehabilitation, reconstruction or
13 renovations that are required for an eligible transportation facility
14 to meet all applicable standards set forth in the public-private
15 partnership upon reversion of the eligible transportation facility to
16 this State.

17 (l) Provide for security and law enforcement.

18 (m) Identify any specifications of the Department that must be
19 satisfied, including, without limitation, provisions allowing the
20 private partner to request and receive authorization to deviate
21 from the specifications on making a showing satisfactory to the
22 Department.

23 (n) Specify remedies available and procedures for dispute
24 resolution, including, without limitation, the right of the private
25 partner to institute legal proceedings to obtain an enforceable
26 judgment or award against the Department in the event of a
27 default by the Department and procedures for use of dispute
28 review boards, mediation, facilitated negotiation, nonbinding and
29 binding arbitration and other alternative dispute resolution
30 procedures.

31 2. A public-private partnership must contain a provision by
32 which the private partner expressly agrees to be barred from
33 seeking injunctive or other equitable relief to delay, prevent or
34 otherwise hinder the Department from developing or constructing
35 a facility which was planned at the time the public-private
36 partnership was executed and which may impact the revenue that
37 the private partner derives from the eligible transportation facility
38 developed under the public-private partnership. The public-private
39 partnership may provide for reasonable compensation to the
40 private partner for the adverse effect on revenue from the eligible
41 transportation facility developed under the public-private
42 partnership resulting from the development or construction of
43 another facility by the Department.



1 **Sec. 19. 1. If the Department enters into a public-private**
2 *partnership pursuant to section 12 of this act and the eligible*
3 *transportation facility involves user fees, the Board:*

4 *(a) Shall establish a schedule or methodology for the charging*
5 *of user fees by the Department or the private partner for the use of*
6 *the eligible transportation facility. Such a schedule or*
7 *methodology may include, without limitation, provisions for*
8 *adjusting the user fees based on the type of motor vehicle, time of*
9 *day, traffic conditions or other factors determined necessary by the*
10 *Department or the private partner to implement, finance or*
11 *improve the performance of the eligible transportation facility;*

12 *(b) Shall, consistent with the provisions of section 22 of this*
13 *act, establish the schedule of administrative fines, late charges and*
14 *other penalties or charges which may be imposed against any*
15 *person who violates any regulation or rule governing the use of*
16 *the eligible transportation facility or who fails to pay a user fee;*
17 *and*

18 *(c) In addition to the exemptions provided in subsection 2, may*
19 *provide for exemptions from the payment of a user fee and may*
20 *authorize the private partner to provide for such exemptions.*

21 **2. The following motor vehicles are exempt from any user fee**
22 *established by the Board:*

23 *(a) A preregistered vehicle transporting a number of occupants*
24 *that is specified in the public-private partnership or otherwise*
25 *specified by the Board;*

37 **2.** *The data, including, without limitation, photographs,*
38 *images, videotapes and other information about the motor vehicle*

8 2. *If a driver or registered owner fails to pay a user fee, the*

All money that is received and is to be retained by the Department pursuant to a public-private partnership which is derived from the imposition of any charge with respect to the operation of any motor vehicle upon any public highway in this State must be deposited in the State Highway Fund, accounted for separately and, except for costs of administration, be used exclusively for the design, construction, operation, maintenance, financing and repair of the public highways of this State. The money must first be used to defray the obligations of the Department under the public-private partnership, including, without limitation, the costs of administration, design, construction, operation, maintenance, financing and repair of the eligible transportation facility from which the money is derived.

The first publication of the advertisement in the daily newspapers having general circulation throughout the State must be made not less than 15 days before the time set for opening bids.

408.333 Except as otherwise provided in NRS 408.3875 to 408.3887, inclusive ~~[§]~~, *and sections 2 to 32, inclusive, of this act:*

Before furnishing any person proposing to bid on any advertised work with the plans and specifications for such work, the Director shall require from the person a statement, verified under oath, in the form of answers to questions contained in a standard form of questionnaire and financial statement, which must include a complete statement of the person's financial ability and experience in performing public work of a similar nature.

2. Such statements must be filed with the Director in ample time to permit the Department to verify the information contained therein in advance of furnishing proposal forms, plans and specifications to any person proposing to bid on the advertised public work, in accordance with the regulations of the Department.

3. Whenever the Director is not satisfied with the sufficiency of the answers contained in the questionnaire and financial statement, the Director may refuse to furnish the person with plans and specifications and the official proposal forms on the advertised project. Any bid of any person to whom plans and specifications and the official proposal forms have not been issued in accordance with this section must be disregarded, and the certified check, cash or undertaking of such a bidder returned forthwith.



4. Any person who is disqualified by the Director, in accordance with the provisions of this section, may request, in writing, a hearing before the Director and present again the person's check, cash or undertaking and such further evidence with respect to the person's financial responsibility, organization, plant and equipment, or experience, as might tend to justify, in his or her opinion, issuance to him or her of the plans and specifications for the work.

5. Such a person may appeal the decision of the Director to the Board no later than 5 days before the opening of the bids on the project. If the appeal is sustained by the Board, the person must be granted the rights and privileges of all other bidders.

Sec. 35. NRS 408.337 is hereby amended to read as follows:

408.337 Except as otherwise provided in NRS 408.3875 to 408.3887, inclusive ~~H~~, *and sections 2 to 32, inclusive, of this act:*

All bids must be accompanied by an undertaking executed by a corporate surety authorized to do business in the State, or by cash or a certified check in an amount equal to at least 5 percent of the amount bid. Such undertaking, cash or check furnished to accompany a bid submitted on-line pursuant to NRS 408.343 must be furnished in accordance with the procedures set forth by the Director.

If the Director deems it is for the best interests of the State, the Director may, on refusal or failure of the successful bidder to execute the contract, award it to the second lowest responsible bidder. If the second lowest responsible bidder fails or refuses to execute the contract, the Director may likewise award it to the third lowest responsible bidder. On the failure or refusal to execute the contract of the second or third lowest bidder to whom a contract is so awarded, their bidder's security is likewise forfeited to the State.

5. The bidder's security of the second and third lowest responsible bidders may be withheld by the Department until the contract has been finally executed and the bond given as required under the provisions of the contract, at which time the security must be returned. The bidder's security submitted by all other
