

SENATE BILL NO. 96—SENATOR HARDY

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions governing the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship Program. (BDR 34-586)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to education; requiring a student to perform community service as a condition to receipt of a Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship; requiring the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada to establish an appeal process for students who are unable to complete the required community service; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law establishes the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship Program  
2 and prescribes the eligibility requirements for receipt of a Millennium Scholarship.  
3 (NRS 396.911-396.938) This bill revises the eligibility requirements by requiring a  
4 student to perform at least 20 hours of community service which meets certain  
5 criteria established by the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada during the  
6 4 years before the student first becomes eligible for a Millennium Scholarship. This  
7 requirement will first apply to students who are eligible to receive a Millennium  
8 Scholarship on and after June 1, 2014.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 396.930 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2           396.930   1. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 2 and  
3       3, a student may apply to the Board of Regents for a Millennium  
4       Scholarship if the student:

1       (a) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph ~~(e)~~ *(f)* of  
2 subsection 2, has been a resident of this State for at least 2 years  
3 before the student applies for the Millennium Scholarship;

4       (b) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (c), graduated  
5 from a public or private high school in this State:

6              (1) After May 1, 2000, but not later than May 1, 2003; or

7              (2) After May 1, 2003, and, except as otherwise provided in  
8 paragraphs ~~(e),~~ *(d)*, *(e)* and ~~(f)~~ *(g)* of subsection 2, not more than  
9 6 years before the student applies for the Millennium Scholarship;

10       (c) Does not satisfy the requirements of paragraph (b) and:

11              (1) Was enrolled as a pupil in a public or private high school  
12 in this State with a class of pupils who were regularly scheduled to  
13 graduate after May 1, 2000;

14              (2) Received his or her high school diploma within 4 years  
15 after he or she was regularly scheduled to graduate; and

16              (3) Applies for the Millennium Scholarship not more than 6  
17 years after he or she was regularly scheduled to graduate from high  
18 school;

19       (d) Maintained in high school in the courses designated by the  
20 Board of Regents pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 2, at least:

21              (1) A 3.00 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if the  
22 student was a member of the graduating class of 2003 or 2004;

23              (2) A 3.10 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if the  
24 student was a member of the graduating class of 2005 or 2006; or

25              (3) A 3.25 grade point average on a 4.0 grading scale, if the  
26 student was a member of the graduating class of 2007 or a later  
27 graduating class; ~~and~~

28       (e) *Is eligible for a Millennium Scholarship on or after June 1,  
29 2014, and submits a statement on or before June 1 of the year in  
30 which the student will enroll in an eligible institution which  
31 documents that the student has performed at least 20 hours of  
32 community service for this State, a political subdivision of this  
33 State or a charitable organization that provides service to a  
34 community or the residents of a community in this State during  
35 the 4 years before the student first becomes eligible for the  
36 Millennium Scholarship; and*

37       (f) Is enrolled in at least:

38              (1) Six semester credit hours in a community college within  
39 the System;

40              (2) Twelve semester credit hours in another eligible  
41 institution; or

42              (3) A total of 12 or more semester credit hours in eligible  
43 institutions if the student is enrolled in more than one eligible  
44 institution.

45       2. The Board of Regents:



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1       (a) Shall define the core curriculum that a student must complete  
2 in high school to be eligible for a Millennium Scholarship.

3       (b) Shall designate the courses in which a student must earn the  
4 minimum grade point averages set forth in paragraph (d) of  
5 subsection 1.

6       (c) *Shall establish criteria for the performance of community*  
7 *service required by paragraph (e) of subsection 1 and a process of*  
8 *appeal for students who are unable to complete the community*  
9 *service.*

10     (d) May establish criteria with respect to students who have  
11 been on active duty serving in the Armed Forces of the United  
12 States to exempt such students from the 6-year limitation on  
13 applications that is set forth in subparagraph (2) of paragraph (b) of  
14 subsection 1.

15     ~~(e)~~ (e) Shall establish criteria with respect to students who  
16 have a documented physical or mental disability or who were  
17 previously subject to an individualized education program under the  
18 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §§ 1400 et  
19 seq., or a plan under Title V of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29  
20 U.S.C. §§ 791 et seq. The criteria must provide an exemption for  
21 those students from:

22       (1) The 6-year limitation on applications that is set forth in  
23 subparagraph (2) of paragraph (b) of subsection 1 and subparagraph  
24 (3) of paragraph (c) of subsection 1 and any limitation applicable to  
25 students who are eligible pursuant to subparagraph (1) of paragraph  
26 (b) of subsection 1.

27       (2) The minimum number of credits prescribed in paragraph  
28 ~~(f)~~ (f) of subsection 1.

29     ~~(e)~~ (f) Shall establish criteria with respect to students who  
30 have a parent or legal guardian on active duty in the Armed  
31 Forces of the United States to exempt such students from the  
32 residency requirement set forth in paragraph (a) of subsection 1 or  
33 subsection 3.

34     ~~(e)~~ (g) Shall establish criteria with respect to students who  
35 have been actively serving or participating in a charitable, religious  
36 or public service assignment or mission to exempt such students  
37 from the 6-year limitation on applications that is set forth in  
38 subparagraph (2) of paragraph (b) of subsection 1. Such criteria  
39 must provide for the award of Millennium Scholarships to those  
40 students who qualify for the exemption and who otherwise meet the  
41 eligibility criteria to the extent that money is available to award  
42 Millennium Scholarships to the students after all other obligations  
43 for the award of Millennium Scholarships for the current school  
44 year have been satisfied.



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1       3. Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (c) of subsection  
2 1, for students who did not graduate from a public or private high  
3 school in this State and who, except as otherwise provided in  
4 paragraph ~~(E)~~ (f) of subsection 2, have been residents of this State  
5 for at least 2 years, the Board of Regents shall establish:

- 6       (a) The minimum score on a standardized test that such students  
7 must receive; or  
8       (b) Other criteria that students must meet,  
9 → to be eligible for Millennium Scholarships.

10      4. In awarding Millennium Scholarships, the Board of Regents  
11 shall enhance its outreach to students who:

- 12       (a) Are pursuing a career in education or health care;  
13       (b) Come from families who lack sufficient financial resources  
14 to pay for the costs of sending their children to an eligible  
15 institution; or  
16       (c) Substantially participated in an antismoking, antidrug or  
17 antialcohol program during high school.

18      5. The Board of Regents shall establish a procedure by which  
19 an applicant for a Millennium Scholarship is required to execute an  
20 affidavit declaring the applicant's eligibility for a Millennium  
21 Scholarship pursuant to the requirements of this section. The  
22 affidavit must include a declaration that the applicant is a citizen of  
23 the United States or has lawful immigration status, or that the  
24 applicant has filed an application to legalize the applicant's  
25 immigration status or will file an application to legalize his or her  
26 immigration status as soon as he or she is eligible to do so.

27      **Sec. 2.** On or before January 1, 2012, the Board of Regents of  
28 the University of Nevada shall adopt the criteria required by  
29 paragraph (c) of subsection 2 of NRS 396.930, as amended by  
30 section 1 of this act. The Board of Regents shall ensure that the  
31 school districts in this State are provided with adequate notice of  
32 the criteria and otherwise provide for public dissemination of the  
33 criteria.

34      **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2011.

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
