

SENATE BILL NO. 97—SENATOR WIENER

PREFILED JANUARY 25, 2011

Referred to Committee on Health and Human Services

SUMMARY—Removes the prospective expiration of certain provisions governing the list of preferred prescription drugs to be used for the Medicaid program. (BDR S-940)

AN ACT relating to health care; removing the prospective expiration of provisions governing the list of preferred prescription drugs to be used for the Medicaid program; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Under existing law, the Department of Health and Human Services is required
2 to develop by regulation a list of preferred prescription drugs to be used for the
3 Medicaid program. The Department is also required to establish a list of
4 prescription drugs that must be excluded from any restrictions that are imposed on
5 drugs that are on the list of preferred prescription drugs. Existing law further
6 requires the Department to include certain specified drugs on the list of drugs
7 excluded from the restrictions. (NRS 422.4025) Before July 1, 2010, the
8 Department was required to exclude certain atypical and typical antipsychotic
9 medications, anticonvulsant medications and antidiabetic medications from the
10 restrictions that are imposed on drugs which are on the list of preferred prescription
11 drugs, but the Legislature suspended this requirement for the period from July 1,
12 2010, to June 30, 2011. (Chapter 4, Statutes of Nevada 2010, 26th Special Session,
13 p. 35) This bill removes the prospective expiration of such provisions, which has
14 the effect of continuing the inclusion of those types of medications in the
15 restrictions that are imposed on drugs which are on the list of preferred prescription
16 drugs after June 30, 2011.



THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 4 of chapter 4, Statutes of Nevada 2010,
26th Special Session, at page 37, is hereby amended to read as
follows:

Sec. 4. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2010 . ~~and expires by limitation on June 30, 2011.~~

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
