KIECKHEFER, MCGINNESS, ROBERSON AND SETTELMEYER

**SUMMARY**—Urges the Federal Government and certain other governmental entities to expedite and streamline the requirements for conducting mining operations in this State. (BDR R-1035)

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SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION—Urging the Federal Government and certain other governmental entities to expedite and streamline the requirements for conducting mining operations in this State.

1 WHEREAS, Since the earliest days of statehood, the State of  
2 Nevada has been known for containing vast deposits of minerals  
3 located throughout the State; and

4 WHEREAS, Because of the availability of those mineral deposits,  
5 mining is one of the larger industries in the State of Nevada which  
6 has traditionally provided many high-paying jobs for local  
7 communities and has contributed to the communities in other ways  
8 such as investing in infrastructure and services for those  
9 communities; and

10 WHEREAS, Mining operations in the State of Nevada are highly  
11 regulated by numerous governmental entities at the state and federal  
12 levels, including, without limitation, regulation by Congress, the  
13 Secretary of Agriculture, the Secretary of the Interior, the Bureau of  
14 Land Management, the United States Forest Service and the  
15 Division of Environmental Protection of the State Department of  
16 Conservation and Natural Resources; and



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1        WHEREAS, Because of that regulation, to conduct a mining  
2 operation in the State of Nevada, an owner or operator of a mine  
3 must comply with numerous requirements, including, without  
4 limitation, preparing and filing a notice or plan of operation,  
5 obtaining the appropriate air quality and water quality permits,  
6 obtaining a permit to appropriate water for use in the mining  
7 operation, obtaining rights-of-way for access to and the transmission  
8 of electricity for the mining operation and obtaining a local business  
9 license; and

10      WHEREAS, Complying with those requirements is often  
11 burdensome and expensive, sometimes requiring up to 10 years and  
12 more than \$1 billion before a mining operation is able to produce  
13 any minerals; and

14      WHEREAS, In recent years, the need for developing energy from  
15 geothermal, solar, wind and other sources has become increasingly  
16 important; and

17      WHEREAS, To meet that need, the procedure for obtaining  
18 permits and rights-of-way and complying with other requirements to  
19 develop those sources of energy have recently been expedited and  
20 streamlined; and

21      WHEREAS, The expeditious development of mineral deposits in  
22 this State is also essential for the creation of jobs, the payment of  
23 taxes and the continued contribution of infrastructure and services to  
24 local communities by the mining industry in this State; now,  
25 therefore, be it

26      RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF  
27 NEVADA, JOINTLY, That the Federal Government and each  
28 governmental entity in this State which regulates the activities of  
29 mining operations in this State are hereby urged to expedite and  
30 streamline the procedure for obtaining permits and complying with  
31 any other requirement for conducting those mining operations in this  
32 State; and be it further

33      RESOLVED, That the Secretary of the Senate prepare and  
34 transmit a copy of this resolution to the Secretary of Agriculture, the  
35 Secretary of the Interior, the Chief of the United States Forest  
36 Service, the Director of the Bureau of Land Management, each  
37 member of the Nevada Congressional Delegation, the Governor of  
38 the State of Nevada, the Director of the State Department of  
39 Conservation and Natural Resources and the Administrator of the  
40 Division of Environmental Protection of the State Department of  
41 Conservation and Natural Resources; and be it further

42      RESOLVED, That this resolution becomes effective upon  
43 passage.
