CHAIR PARKS:

We will open up the work session on Senate Bill (S.B.) 45.

SENATE BILL 45: Revises provisions conferring the powers of a peace officer upon certain personnel of the Department of Public Safety. (BDR 23-463)

CAROL STONEFIELD (Policy Analyst):

The work session document (Exhibit C) itemizes each bill on the agenda. Senate Bill 45 was requested by the Department of Public Safety. It proposes that generally all personnel assigned to a sworn position in any division of the Department of Public Safety have the powers of a peace officer. Parole and probation officers, assistants and deputies of the State Fire Marshal, and the personnel of the Capitol Police Division are changed from category II peace officers

to category I. Technical changes are made to remove redundant language referring to the State Fire Marshal, who is already exempt from certification by the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission. This bill would be effective upon passage and approval. There have been no amendments offered at this time.

SENATE BILL 125: Revises provisions governing reporting of campaign contributions and expenses. (BDR 24-777)

Ms. Stonefield:

<u>Senate Bill 125</u> was sponsored by Senator Ben Kieckhefer. It provides that under law, certain contributions and expenditures must be reported to the Secretary of State seven days prior to the primary, general or special election. This bill proposes to revise the dates to require the filing of the reports seven days before the beginning of early voting by personal appearance. There have been no amendments proposed.

SENATOR CEGAVSKE MOVED TO DO PASS S.B. 125.
