MICHELLE VAN GEEL (Committee Policy Analyst):

Here is an overview of the Committee Brief and a review of the 120-day Session deadline (Exhibit D). The jurisdiction of this Committee is discussed in the first few pages. There are changes in the types of bills the Committee will hear, such as bills related to hazardous materials, historic preservation, archeology, and State parks and monuments. Other topics reassigned to other committees this Session include the State Engineer, underground water and wells, and regional planning and management.

During the 2009 Legislative Session, the Committee reviewed a total of 42 bills and resolutions. Twenty-eight of those measures were passed by the Legislature and became law. Two of those bills were vetoed by the Governor, and those vetoes were subsequently overturned by the Legislature. Two of those bills became law without the Governor's signature. Five resolutions were filed with the Secretary of State. Some of the major issues the Committee reviewed during the 2009 Session are shown on page 5 of the Brief. Those issues included awarding sub-grants for programs authorized by the federal Safe Drinking Water Act, restraining and penning dogs, placing recycling containers on the premises of certain apartment complexes and regulating the operation of facilities for management of waste tires. Page 5 of the Brief also shows a table listing the major deadlines for this Session. A list of the prefiled bills and a list of interest groups are found on attachments A and B.
