## **BILLS**

<u>S.B. 72</u> (R1)	Revises provisions governing the assignment of certain criminal offenders to residential confinement. (BDR 16-120)
<u>S.B. 75</u>	Establishes a program to provide private equity funding to businesses engaged in certain industries in this State. (BDR 31-523)
<u>S.B. 188</u> (R1)	Revises provisions relating to the work schedules of certain employees of the Department of Corrections. (BDR 23-699)
<u>S.B. 265</u> (R1)	Revises provisions governing sentencing of criminal offenders and determining eligibility of prisoners for parole. (BDR 14-311)
<u>S.B. 349</u>	Provides for the establishment of a community court pilot project to provide an alternative to sentencing for misdemeanor offenders. (BDR S-387)
<u>S.B. 443</u>	Requires counties to pay the expense of presentence or general investigations and reports made by the Division of Parole and Probation of the Department of Public Safety. (BDR 14-1202)
