SUMMARY—Revises provisions concerning child death review teams. (BDR 38-611)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets ***[omitted material]*** is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to the protection of children; authorizing a multidisciplinary team to review the death of a child to use data collected concerning the death of a child for research and prevention purposes in certain circumstances; consolidating the administrative teams that review the report and recommendations of a multidisciplinary team appointed to review the death of a child and the Executive Committee to Review the Death of Children; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Under existing law, the director or other authorized representative of an agency which provides child welfare services and the Executive Committee to Review the Death of Children are authorized to appoint a multidisciplinary team to review certain records concerning the death of a child. (NRS 432B.403-432B.407, 432B.409) **Section 1** of this bill authorizes a multidisciplinary team to review the death of a child to use data collected concerning the death of a child for research and prevention purposes if the data is aggregated and does not allow for the identification of any person.

An administrative team consisting of administrators of agencies which provide child welfare services, and agencies responsible for vital statistics, public health, mental health and public safety is required to review the report and recommendations of a multidisciplinary team. (NRS 432B.408) **Section 2** of this



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13 bill consolidates the administrative team into the Executive Committee and requires  
14 the Executive Committee to review the report and recommendations of a  
15 multidisciplinary team. **Section 3** of this bill provides that certain members of the  
16 Executive Committee who are administrators of agencies which provide child  
17 welfare services, and agencies responsible for mental health and public safety, must  
18 serve as nonvoting members of the Executive Committee.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 432B.407 is hereby amended to read as  
2 follows:

3 432B.407 1. A multidisciplinary team to review the death of  
4 a child is entitled to access to:

5 (a) All investigative information of law enforcement agencies  
6 regarding the death;

7 (b) Any autopsy and coroner's investigative records relating to  
8 the death;

9 (c) Any medical or mental health records of the child; and

10 (d) Any records of social and rehabilitative services or of any  
11 other social service agency which has provided services to the child  
12 or the child's family.

13 2. Each organization represented on a multidisciplinary team to  
14 review the death of a child shall share with other members of the  
15 team information in its possession concerning the child who is the  
16 subject of the review, any siblings of the child, any person who was  
17 responsible for the welfare of the child and any other information  
18 deemed by the organization to be pertinent to the review.

19 3. A multidisciplinary team to review the death of a child may,  
20 if appropriate, meet and share information with a multidisciplinary  
21 team to review the death of the victim of a crime that constitutes  
22 domestic violence organized or sponsored pursuant to NRS 217.475  
23 or 228.495.

24 4. A multidisciplinary team to review the death of a child may  
25 petition the district court for the issuance of, and the district court  
26 may issue, a subpoena to compel the production of any books,  
27 records or papers relevant to the cause of any death being  
28 investigated by the team. Except as otherwise provided in NRS  
29 239.0115, any books, records or papers received by the team  
30 pursuant to the subpoena shall be deemed confidential and  
31 privileged and not subject to disclosure.

32 5. *A multidisciplinary team to review the death of a child may  
33 use data collected concerning the death of a child for the purpose  
34 of research or to prevent future deaths of children if the data is  
35 aggregated and does not allow for the identification of any person.*



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1       **6.** Except as otherwise provided in this section, information  
2 acquired by, and the records of, a multidisciplinary team to review  
3 the death of a child are confidential, must not be disclosed, and are  
4 not subject to subpoena, discovery or introduction into evidence in  
5 any civil or criminal proceeding.

6       **Sec. 2.** NRS 432B.408 is hereby amended to read as follows:

7       432B.408 1. The report and recommendations of a  
8 multidisciplinary team to review the death of a child must be  
9 transmitted ~~[to an administrative team]~~ for review ~~[to]~~.

10      **~~2. An administrative team must consist of administrators of agencies which provide child welfare services, and agencies responsible for vital statistics, public health, mental health and public safety.~~**

11      **~~3. to the Executive Committee to Review the Death of Children established pursuant to NRS 432B.409.~~**

12      **2.** The ~~administrative team~~ **Executive Committee** shall  
13 review the report and recommendations and respond in writing to  
14 the multidisciplinary team within 90 days after receiving the report.

15       **Sec. 3.** NRS 432B.409 is hereby amended to read as follows:

16       432B.409 1. The Administrator of the Division of Child and  
17 Family Services shall establish an Executive Committee to Review  
18 the Death of Children, consisting of ~~representatives~~:

19       **(a) Representatives** from multidisciplinary teams formed  
20 pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection 1 of NRS 432B.405 and  
21 NRS 432B.406, vital statistics, law enforcement, public health and  
22 the Office of the Attorney General.

23       **~~(b) Administrators of agencies which provide child welfare services, and agencies responsible for mental health and public safety, to the extent that such administrators are not already appointed pursuant to paragraph (a). Members of the Executive Committee who are appointed pursuant to this paragraph shall serve as nonvoting members.~~**

24       **2.** The Executive Committee shall:

25       (a) Adopt statewide protocols for the review of the death of a  
26 child;

27       (b) Adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of NRS  
28 432B.403 to 432B.4095, inclusive;

29       (c) Adopt bylaws to govern the management and operation of  
30 the Executive Committee;

31       (d) Appoint one or more multidisciplinary teams to review  
32 the death of a child from the names submitted to the Executive  
33 Committee pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 1 of  
34 NRS 432B.405;

35       (e) Oversee training and development of multidisciplinary teams  
36 to review the death of children; ~~and~~



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1       (f) Compile and distribute a statewide annual report, including  
2 statistics and recommendations for regulatory and policy changes ~~+~~  
3 ~~—34 ; and~~

4       (g) ***Carry out the duties specified in NRS 432B.408.***

5       3. The Review of Death of Children Account is hereby created  
6 in the State General Fund. The Executive Committee may use  
7 money in the Account to carry out the provisions of NRS 432B.403  
8 to 432B.4095, inclusive.

9       **Sec. 4.** NRS 432B.4095 is hereby amended to read as follows:

10      432B.4095 1. Each member of a multidisciplinary team  
11 organized pursuant to NRS 432B.405, a multidisciplinary team  
12 organized pursuant to NRS 432B.4075 ~~+, an administrative team~~  
13 ~~organized pursuant to NRS 432B.408~~ or the Executive Committee  
14 to Review the Death of Children established pursuant to NRS  
15 432B.409 who discloses any confidential information concerning  
16 the death of a child is personally liable for a civil penalty of not  
17 more than \$500.

18      2. The Administrator of the Division of Child and Family  
19 Services:

20       (a) May bring an action to recover a civil penalty imposed  
21 pursuant to subsection 1 against a member of a multidisciplinary  
22 team organized pursuant to NRS 432B.4075 ~~+, an administrative~~  
23 ~~team~~ or the Executive Committee; and

24       (b) Shall deposit any money received from the civil penalty with  
25 the State Treasurer for credit to the State General Fund.

26       3. Each director or other authorized representative of an agency  
27 which provides child welfare services that organized a  
28 multidisciplinary team pursuant to NRS 432B.405:

29       (a) May bring an action to recover a civil penalty pursuant to  
30 subsection 1 against a member of the multidisciplinary team; and

31       (b) Shall deposit any money received from the civil penalty in  
32 the appropriate county treasury.

33       **Sec. 5.** As soon as practicable after July 1, 2013, the  
34 Administrator of the Division of Child and Family Services of the  
35 Department of Health and Human Services shall appoint to  
36 the Executive Committee to Review the Death of Children  
37 established pursuant to NRS 432B.409 the additional members of  
38 the Executive Committee required by paragraph (b) of subsection 1  
39 of NRS 432B.409, as amended by section 3 of this act.

40       **Sec. 6.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013.
