
ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 163—COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

SUMMARY—Provides for early childhood prekindergarten education programs. (BDR S-723)

AN ACT relating to education; providing for the distribution of money to school districts that include one or more Title I elementary schools to provide early childhood prekindergarten education programs; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 This bill provides for the distribution of money to school districts that include
2 one or more elementary schools that are Title I schools to provide early childhood
3 prekindergarten education programs to children in the school district.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** 1. The Department of Education shall distribute
2 the appropriation made by section 2 of this act to school districts
3 that include one or more elementary schools that are Title I schools
4 and are not currently providing early childhood education programs
5 funded by the Federal Government. Each allocation to a school
6 district pursuant to this section must be calculated by multiplying
7 the number of children who reside within the zone of attendance of
8 those Title I schools in the school district by six-tenths of the basic
9 support guarantee per pupil for the school district established by law
10 for Fiscal Year 2014-2015.



1 2. A school district that receives an allocation of money
2 pursuant to this section shall use the money to provide early
3 childhood prekindergarten education programs for children in the
4 school district. A school district shall allocate the money by
5 assigning first priority to those schools within the school district that
6 have the highest percentage of children who are eligible for free or
7 reduced-price lunches. If a school within a school district currently
8 provides early childhood prekindergarten education programs with
9 money that it receives from the Federal Government, the school
10 district shall not allocate the money from the appropriation made by
11 section 2 of this act to the school.

12 3. A school district that receives a grant of money pursuant to
13 this section shall:

14 (a) Provide notice of the early childhood prekindergarten
15 education programs to residents of the school district and encourage
16 parents and legal guardians of children who are eligible to
17 participate in such a program to enroll in the program; and

18 (b) Submit a report to the Department regarding the efforts
19 undertaken by the school district to inform the residents of the
20 school district of the program and to encourage the enrollment of
21 children who are eligible for enrollment.

22 4. A school that receives an allocation of money pursuant to
23 this section shall:

24 (a) Use the money to establish or expand early childhood
25 prekindergarten education programs and offer the program free of
26 charge to children who are eligible for enrollment.

27 (b) Use the money to supplement and not replace the money that
28 the school would otherwise expend for early childhood
29 prekindergarten education programs.

30 5. On or before February 1, 2015, the Department of Education
31 shall submit to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for
32 transmittal to the 78th Session of the Legislature a report which
33 includes, without limitation:

34 (a) An identification of which school districts received an
35 allocation pursuant to this section;

36 (b) A compilation of the reports submitted to the Department
37 pursuant to subsection 3 by each school district that received an
38 allocation pursuant to this section;

39 (c) The number of schools in each school district that offered
40 early childhood prekindergarten education programs funded by the
41 allocation;

42 (d) The number of children who received services through an
43 early childhood prekindergarten education program funded by the
44 allocation;



1 (e) The developmental progress of children before and after their
2 completion of an early childhood prekindergarten education
3 program funded by the allocation;

4 (f) The involvement of parents and families whose children
5 participated in an early childhood prekindergarten education
6 program funded by the allocation; and

7 (g) Any recommendations for legislation related to early
8 childhood prekindergarten education programs.

9 6. As used in this section, "Title I school" has the meaning
10 ascribed to it in NRS 385.3467.

11 **Sec. 2.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State
12 General Fund to the Department of Education for Fiscal Year 2014-
13 2015, the sum of \$20,000,000, for allocation to school districts to
14 provide early childhood education programs pursuant to section 1 of
15 this act.

16 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by
17 subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30,
18 2015, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity
19 to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise
20 transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated
21 money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after
22 September 18, 2015, by either the entity to which the money was
23 appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently
24 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General
25 Fund on or before September 18, 2015.

26 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013.
