

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 313—ASSEMBLYWOMAN PIERCE

MARCH 18, 2013

Referred to Committee on Judiciary

SUMMARY—Creates a statutory subcommittee of the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice. (BDR 14-421)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: Increases or Newly Provides for Term of Imprisonment in County or City Jail or Detention Facility.
Effect on the State: Yes.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to criminal procedure; creating a statutory subcommittee of the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice to consider issues concerning electronic surveillance by law enforcement; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

This bill creates in statute the Subcommittee on Search and Seizure Law and Technology of the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice. This bill requires: (1) the Chair of the Commission to appoint the members of the Subcommittee; (2) that the Subcommittee consist of legislative members and certain nonlegislative members; (3) the Chair of the Subcommittee to be a legislative member of the Commission; and (4) the Subcommittee to consider issues concerning electronic surveillance by law enforcement and to evaluate, review and submit a report to the Commission with findings and recommendations concerning such issues for proposed legislation. This bill also sets forth the salaries and per diem that members of the Subcommittee may receive.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 176 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 ***1. There is hereby created the Subcommittee on Search and***
Seizure Law and Technology of the Commission.



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1 2. *The Chair of the Commission shall appoint the members of
2 the Subcommittee. The Subcommittee must consist of legislative
3 and nonlegislative members, including, without limitation:*

4 (a) *A representative of the public defender's office in Washoe
5 County.*

6 (b) *A representative of the public defender's office in Clark
7 County.*

8 (c) *A representative of the State Public Defender's Office.*

9 (d) *A member of the private criminal defense bar.*

10 (e) *A representative of a civil liberties organization.*

11 (f) *A representative of the district attorney's office in Washoe
12 County.*

13 (g) *A representative of the district attorney's office in Clark
14 County.*

15 (h) *A representative of the Attorney General.*

16 (i) *A representative of a law enforcement agency located
17 within the jurisdiction of Washoe County.*

18 (j) *A representative of a law enforcement agency located
19 within the jurisdiction of Clark County.*

20 (k) *A representative of the academic community with
21 specialized knowledge in the field of search and seizure law and
22 technology.*

23 (l) *A representative from the compliance division of a national
24 telecommunications carrier authorized to do business in this State.*

25 3. *The Chair of the Commission shall designate one of the
26 legislative members of the Commission as Chair of the
27 Subcommittee.*

28 4. *The Subcommittee shall meet at the times and places
29 specified by a call of the Chair. A majority of the members of the
30 Subcommittee constitutes a quorum, and a quorum may exercise
31 any power or authority conferred on the Subcommittee.*

32 5. *The Subcommittee shall consider issues concerning
33 electronic surveillance by law enforcement, including, without
34 limitation, access by a law enforcement agency to historical and
35 prospective geolocation data generated by a telecommunications
36 device for tracking purposes and the use of mobile tracking
37 devices, and shall evaluate, review and submit a report to the
38 Commission with findings and recommendations concerning such
39 issues for proposed legislation.*

40 6. *Any Legislators who are members of the Subcommittee are
41 entitled to receive the salary provided for a majority of
42 the members of the Legislature during the first 60 days of the
43 preceding session for each day's attendance at a meeting of the
44 Subcommittee.*



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1 *7. While engaged in the business of the Subcommittee, to the
2 extent of legislative appropriation, each member of the
3 Subcommittee is entitled to receive the per diem allowance and
4 travel expenses provided for state officers and employees
5 generally.*

6 **Sec. 2.** NRS 176.0121 is hereby amended to read as follows:
7 176.0121 As used in NRS 176.0121 to 176.0129, inclusive,
8 **and section 1 of this act,** “Commission” means the Advisory
9 Commission on the Administration of Justice.

10 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013, and expires
11 by limitation on July 31, 2015.

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
