AN ACT relating to counties; authorizing a board of county commissioners to enter into agreements exempting certain persons, organizations and assemblies occurring on federal lands from certain requirements and prohibitions relating to assemblies; requiring such agreements to include certain provisions; prohibiting certain actions regarding such agreements and the application of certain requirements and prohibitions relating to certain assemblies occurring on federal lands; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law requires each board of county commissioners to adopt an  
2 ordinance regulating and licensing outdoor assemblies, requires certain persons to  
3 obtain a license for an assembly and prohibits certain conduct and activities relating  
4 to certain assemblies. (NRS 244.354, 244.3542, 244.3548)

5       **Section 1** of this bill authorizes a board of county commissioners to enter into  
6 an agreement with a person or organization that organizes an outdoor assembly  
7 occurring on federal land for which a federal agency issues a license or permit or  
8 otherwise authorizes the assembly. The agreement may exempt the assembly, and

9 the person or organization that organizes the assembly, from the provisions of the  
10 ordinance adopted by the board regulating and licensing outdoor assemblies and  
11 also from the statutory provisions regulating outdoor assemblies. The agreement  
12 may be rescinded only by mutual agreement of the parties. For the duration of the  
13 agreement, a future board of county commissioners may not require the application  
14 of the statutory provisions regulating outdoor assemblies or make any changes to  
15 the terms of the agreement. The agreement must contain certain provisions relating  
16 to the services of a coroner if a death occurs at the assembly. Also, the parties may  
17 enter into a separate agreement for the county to provide reasonable and necessary  
18 services for the assembly and to receive compensation for those services.

19 Existing law prohibits a board of county commissioners from entering into  
20 certain contracts and other transactions beyond the term of office of any member of  
21 the board unless the board appropriates money to pay for the duration of the  
22 contract. **Sections 1 and 1.5** of this bill provide that any agreement entered into  
23 pursuant to **section 1** is not subject to such limitations.

24 **Section 1** provides that the provisions thereof shall not be construed to prohibit,  
25 prevent or limit the power of the Legislature.

---

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** Chapter 244 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3       *1. A board of county commissioners may enter into an  
4 agreement with any person or organization described in  
5 paragraph (b) to exempt from the provisions of any ordinance  
6 adopted by that board of county commissioners pursuant to  
7 NRS 244.354 and the provisions of NRS 244.354 to 244.3548,  
8 inclusive:*

9       *(a) Any assembly occurring on federal land for which a  
10 federal agency issues a license or permit or otherwise authorizes  
11 the assembly; and*

12       *(b) The person or organization that permits, maintains,  
13 promotes, conducts, advertises, operates, undertakes, organizes,  
14 manages or sells or gives away tickets to any such assembly.*

15       *2. In determining whether to enter into an agreement  
16 pursuant to subsection 1, a board of county commissioners may  
17 consider, without limitation, whether a person or organization  
18 described in paragraph (b) of subsection 1 has demonstrated to the  
19 satisfaction of the board that:*

20       *(a) The federal agency that issues a license or permit for or  
21 otherwise authorizes an assembly described in paragraph (a) of  
22 subsection 1 has ensured that conditions which otherwise may be  
23 imposed by the board pursuant to NRS 244.3545 are addressed  
24 during the process of issuing the license or permit for or otherwise  
25 authorizing the assembly; and*

1       (b) The assembly will not present an unreasonable danger to  
2 the health or safety of any resident of the county.

3       3. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 6, an  
4 agreement entered into pursuant to subsection 1 may be rescinded  
5 only by mutual agreement of the parties to the agreement. For the  
6 duration of the agreement, no future board of county  
7 commissioners of that county may adopt an ordinance requiring,  
8 or in any other way require:

9       (a) The application of the provisions of NRS 244.354 to  
10 244.3548, inclusive, to the assembly that is the subject of the  
11 agreement, the person or organization with whom the board enters  
12 into the agreement, or any other person who permits, maintains,  
13 promotes, conducts, advertises, operates, undertakes, organizes,  
14 manages or sells or gives away tickets to the assembly; or

15       (b) Any changes to the terms of the agreement.

16       4. If a board of county commissioners enters into an  
17 agreement pursuant to subsection 1:

18       (a) The agreement must require the person or organization  
19 described in paragraph (b) of subsection 1 to call upon the  
20 services of the office of the county coroner if a death of a person  
21 occurs at the assembly;

22       (b) The agreement must provide for the office of the county  
23 coroner to receive compensation for such services, including,  
24 without limitation, compensation:

25           (1) For the expenses of any travel and subsistence incurred  
26 in the provisions of such services;

27           (2) For the expenses relating to an autopsy and the  
28 transportation and storage of the body of the deceased; and

29           (3) For any other reasonable expenses relating to the  
30 provision of such services; and

31       (c) The board of county commissioners or any board of county  
32 commissioners that takes office after the effective date of the  
33 agreement may enter into a separate agreement with the person or  
34 organization described in paragraph (b) of subsection 1 which  
35 provides for the county to provide reasonable and necessary  
36 services for the assembly and to receive compensation for the  
37 provision of such services.

38       5. Notwithstanding the provisions of NRS 244.320, any  
39 agreement entered into pursuant to this section may extend  
40 beyond the terms of the county commissioners in office and voting  
41 on the agreement regardless of whether the board appropriates  
42 money for the agreement beyond the terms of office.

43       6. Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to  
44 prohibit, prevent or limit the power of the Legislature.

1       **Sec. 1.5.** NRS 244.320 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2       244.320 1. A board of county commissioners may enter into  
3       any **agreement**, contract, lease, franchise, exchange of property or  
4       other transaction which extends beyond the terms of the county  
5       commissioners then in office and voting on the matter, but except as  
6       otherwise provided by law, the **agreement**, contract, lease,  
7       franchise, exchange or other transaction is binding beyond those  
8       terms of office only to the extent that money is appropriated  
9       therefor, or for a like item or service.

10      2. This section does not affect any **agreement**, contract, lease,  
11     franchise, exchange of property or other transaction which does not  
12     extend beyond the term of office of any member of the board who is  
13     part of the quorum voting thereon.

14      **Sec. 2.** (Deleted by amendment.)

15      **Sec. 3.** NRS 244.3542 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
16     244.3542 ~~Every~~ **Except as otherwise provided in section 1 of**  
17 **this act, every** person who permits, maintains, promotes, conducts,  
18 advertises, operates, undertakes, organizes, manages, sells or gives  
19 away tickets to an actual or reasonably anticipated assembly of  
20 1,000 or more individuals shall obtain a license from the board of  
21 county commissioners of the county in which such assembly is  
22 proposed, in accordance with the provisions of NRS 244.354 to  
23 244.3548, inclusive.

24      **Sec. 4.** NRS 244.3548 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
25     244.3548 ~~It~~ **Except as otherwise provided in section 1 of this**  
26 **act, it** is unlawful for any licensee or any employee, agent or  
27 associate of a licensee to:

28      1. Hold an actual or reasonably anticipated assembly of 1,000  
29 or more persons without first procuring a license to do so.

30      2. Sell tickets to such an assembly without a license first  
31 having been obtained.

32      3. Hold such an assembly in such a manner as to create a  
33 public or private nuisance.

34      4. Exhibit, show or conduct within the place of such an  
35 assembly any obscene, indecent, vulgar or lewd exhibition, show,  
36 play, entertainment or exhibit, no matter by what name designated.

37      5. Allow any person on the premises of the licensed assembly  
38 to cause or create a disturbance in, around or near any place of the  
39 assembly, by offensive or disorderly conduct.

40      6. Knowingly allow any person to consume, sell or be in  
41 possession of intoxicating liquor while in such assembly except  
42 where the consumption or possession is expressly authorized by the  
43 board and under the laws of the State of Nevada.

1       7. Knowingly allow any person at the licensed assembly to use,  
2 sell or be in possession of any controlled substance while in, around  
3 or near a place of the assembly.

4       **Sec. 5.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013.
