SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative Commission. (BDR 18-160)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to governmental administration; authorizing the Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative Commission to recommend the auditing of certain boards or commissions; providing that certain members of the Sunset Subcommittee are nonvoting members; decreasing the number of boards and commissions that the Sunset Subcommittee is required to review; removing the requirement that the Sunset Subcommittee submit a written assessment to a board or commission setting forth the costs of a review; requiring the Sunset Subcommittee to submit to the Legislative Commission a proposed list of boards and commissions to be reviewed; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law requires the Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative Commission  
2 to conduct a review of certain boards and commissions in this State. The Sunset  
3 Subcommittee is required to review: (1) not less than 20 such boards and  
4 commissions each year; and (2) each board and commission subject to review not  
5 less than once every 10 years. The Sunset Subcommittee also must submit a written  
6 assessment to each board or commission that is reviewed which sets forth the costs  
7 of the review, and the board or commission must pay such an amount to the Sunset  
8 Subcommittee. (NRS 232B.220) **Section 3** of this bill revises these provisions and



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9 only requires the Sunset Subcommittee to review not less than 10 boards and  
10 commissions each legislative interim. **Section 3** also requires the Sunset  
11 Subcommittee to submit to the Legislative Commission, on or before July 31 of  
12 each odd-numbered year, a proposed list of boards and commissions to be reviewed  
13 during the legislative interim, which the Legislative Commission must consider and  
14 approve with or without revisions. **Section 3** additionally removes the provisions  
15 concerning the written assessment.

16 **Section 1** of this bill provides that at any time during a legislative interim, if the  
17 Sunset Subcommittee determines that a board or commission should be audited, the  
18 Sunset Subcommittee must make a recommendation to the Legislative  
19 Commission, and the Legislative Commission must determine whether to direct the  
20 Legislative Auditor to perform an audit. The Legislative Auditor is prohibited from  
21 performing more than four such audits during a legislative interim.

22 **Section 2** of this bill specifies that the members of the Sunset Subcommittee  
23 who are members of the general public are nonvoting members.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** Chapter 232B of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3       *1. At any time during a legislative interim, if the Sunset  
4 Subcommittee of the Legislative Commission determines that a  
5 board or commission subject to review by the Sunset  
6 Subcommittee should be audited, the Sunset Subcommittee shall  
7 make such a recommendation to the Legislative Commission. The  
8 Sunset Subcommittee shall include with its recommendation a  
9 summary of the justification for the recommendation.*

10       *2. After receiving a recommendation from the Sunset  
11 Subcommittee pursuant to subsection 1, the Legislative  
12 Commission shall evaluate the recommendation and determine  
13 whether to direct the Legislative Auditor to perform an audit of the  
14 board or commission pursuant to NRS 218G.120. In making its  
15 determination, the Legislative Commission shall consider the  
16 current workload of the Audit Division of the Legislative Counsel  
17 Bureau.*

18       *3. The Legislative Auditor shall not perform more than four  
19 audits directed by the Legislative Commission pursuant to this  
20 section during a legislative interim.*

21       **Sec. 2.** NRS 232B.210 is hereby amended to read as follows:

22       232B.210 1. The Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative  
23 Commission, consisting of nine members, is hereby created. The  
24 membership of the Sunset Subcommittee consists of:

25       (a) Three **voting** members of the Legislature appointed by the  
26 Majority Leader of the Senate, at least one of whom must be a  
27 member of the minority political party;



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1       (b) Three **voting** members of the Legislature appointed by the  
2 Speaker of the Assembly, at least one of whom must be a member  
3 of the minority political party; and

4       (c) Three **nonvoting** members of the general public appointed  
5 by the Chair of the Legislative Commission from among the names  
6 of nominees submitted by the Governor pursuant to subsection 2.

7       2. The Governor shall, at least 30 days before the beginning of  
8 the term of any member appointed pursuant to paragraph (c) of  
9 subsection 1, or within 30 days after such a position on the Sunset  
10 Subcommittee becomes vacant, submit to the Legislative  
11 Commission the names of at least three persons qualified for  
12 membership on the Sunset Subcommittee. The Chair of the  
13 Legislative Commission shall appoint a new member or fill the  
14 vacancy from the list, or request a new list. The Chair of  
15 the Legislative Commission may appoint any qualified person who  
16 is a resident of this State to a position described in paragraph (c) of  
17 subsection 1.

18       3. Each member of the Sunset Subcommittee serves at the  
19 pleasure of the appointing authority.

20       4. The **voting** members of the Sunset Subcommittee shall elect  
21 a Chair from one House of the Legislature and a Vice Chair from  
22 the other House. Each Chair and Vice Chair holds office for a term  
23 of 2 years commencing on July 1 of each odd-numbered year. If a  
24 vacancy occurs in the office of Chair or Vice Chair, the vacancy  
25 must be filled in the same manner as the original selection for the  
26 remainder of the unexpired term.

27       5. The membership of any member of the Sunset  
28 Subcommittee who is a Legislator and who is not a candidate for  
29 reelection or who is defeated for reelection terminates on the day  
30 next after the general election.

31       6. A vacancy on the Sunset Subcommittee must be filled in the  
32 same manner as the original appointment.

33       7. The Sunset Subcommittee shall meet at the times and places  
34 specified by a call of the Chair. ~~Five~~ **Four voting** members of the  
35 Sunset Subcommittee constitute a quorum, and a quorum may  
36 exercise any power or authority conferred on the Sunset  
37 Subcommittee.

38       8. For each day or portion of a day during which a member of  
39 the Sunset Subcommittee who is a Legislator attends a meeting of  
40 the Sunset Subcommittee or is otherwise engaged in the business  
41 of the Sunset Subcommittee, except during a regular or special  
42 session of the Legislature, the Legislator is entitled to receive the:

43           (a) Compensation provided for a majority of the members of the  
44 Legislature during the first 60 days of the preceding regular session;

45           (b) Per diem allowance provided for state officers generally; and



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1       (c) Travel expenses provided pursuant to NRS 218A.655.  
2      ↳ The compensation, per diem allowances and travel expenses of  
3      the members of the Sunset Subcommittee who are Legislators must  
4      be paid from the Legislative Fund.

5      9. While engaged in the business of the Sunset Subcommittee,  
6      the members of the Subcommittee who are not Legislators are  
7      entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses  
8      provided for state officers and employees generally.

9      **Sec. 3.** NRS 232B.220 is hereby amended to read as follows:

10     232B.220 1. The Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative  
11     Commission shall conduct a review of each board and commission  
12     in this State which is not provided for in the Nevada Constitution or  
13     established by an executive order of the Governor to determine  
14     whether the board or commission should be terminated, modified,  
15     consolidated with another board or commission or continued. Such a  
16     review must include, without limitation:

17       (a) An evaluation of the major policies and programs of the  
18       board or commission, including, without limitation, an examination  
19       of other programs or services offered in this State to determine if  
20       any other provided programs or services duplicate those offered by  
21       the board or commission;

22       (b) Any recommendations for improvements in the policies and  
23       programs offered by the board or commission; and

24       (c) A determination of whether any statutory tax exemptions,  
25       abatements or money set aside to be provided to the board or  
26       commission should be terminated, modified or continued.

27       2. The Sunset Subcommittee shall review ~~F~~

28       ~~(a) Not~~ ~~not~~ less than ~~120~~ ~~10~~ boards and commissions specified  
29       in subsection 1 each ~~1~~ ~~year~~; and

30       ~~(b) Each of those boards and commissions not less than once  
31       every 10 years.~~

32       ~~3. For each review of a board or commission that the Sunset  
33       Subcommittee conducts, the Sunset Subcommittee shall submit a  
34       written assessment to the board or commission setting forth the  
35       costs of the review. In determining the amount of an assessment  
36       pursuant to this subsection, the Sunset Subcommittee shall consider,  
37       based upon the information provided by the board or commission  
38       pursuant to NRS 232B.230, whether any additional analysis or  
39       evaluation is required to review the board or commission because of  
40       the specialized nature of the board or commission. As soon as  
41       practicable after a board or commission receives a written  
42       assessment pursuant to this subsection, the board or commission  
43       shall pay the amount set forth in the written assessment to the  
44       Sunset Subcommittee.~~



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1   —4— legislative interim. On or before July 31 of each odd-  
2 numbered year, the Sunset Subcommittee shall submit to the  
3 Legislative Commission for its approval a proposed list of such  
4 boards and commissions to be reviewed by the Sunset  
5 Subcommittee during the legislative interim. At the next meeting  
6 of the Legislative Commission which occurs at least 5 business  
7 days after the Legislative Commission receives the proposed list of  
8 boards and commissions, the Legislative Commission shall  
9 consider and may revise the proposed list. The Legislative  
10 Commission shall approve the list with or without revisions at the  
11 meeting.

12   **3.** Any action taken by the Sunset Subcommittee concerning a  
13 board or commission pursuant to NRS 232B.210 to 232B.250,  
14 inclusive, **and section 1 of this act** is in addition or supplemental to  
15 any action taken by the Legislative Commission pursuant to NRS  
16 232B.010 to 232B.100, inclusive.

17   **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.

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
