

## ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 463—COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

(ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION)

MARCH 25, 2013

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Referred to Committee on Ways and Means

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions relating to stale claims and statutory contingency claims. (BDR 31-1123)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to state financial administration; revising provisions relating to the payment of stale claims; authorizing a person designated by the Clerk of the State Board of Examiners to carry out certain duties of the Clerk; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law provides that certain stale claims which are presented by a state agency to the State Board of Examiners after the date on which it is provided by law that money appropriated to the state agency for the previous fiscal year reverts to the fund from which it was appropriated must be paid from the Stale Claims Account in the State General Fund. A state agency is authorized to pay certain other claims incurred in the previous fiscal year from the appropriate budget account in a current fiscal year. (NRS 353.097) **Section 1** of this bill clarifies the definition of “stale claim” to specifically refer to money authorized for expenditure, in addition to appropriated money, and makes similar conforming changes. **Section 1** also provides that a state agency may pay a stale claim for payroll expenses from the appropriate budget account in the current fiscal year.

**Sections 1 and 2** of this bill authorize a person designated by the Clerk of the State Board of Examiners to perform the duties of the Clerk, which have been delegated to the Clerk by the Board of Examiners, to approve stale claims and claims from the Reserve for Statutory Contingency Account on behalf of the Board.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** NRS 353.097 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2      353.097 1. As used in this section, “stale claim” means any  
3      claim ~~to other than a claim for medical expenses submitted by a third-~~  
4      ~~party administrator or a claim which is \$100 or more, and]~~ which is  
5      presented by a state agency to the State Board of Examiners :

6      (a) *If the claim was eligible to be paid from money that was  
7      appropriated,* after the date on which it is provided by law that  
8      money appropriated to that state agency for the previous fiscal year  
9      reverts to the fund from which appropriated ~~H~~; or

10     (b) *If the claim was eligible to be paid from money that was  
11     authorized, after the last day of the fiscal year in which that state  
12     agency was authorized to expend the money.*

13     2. There is hereby created a Stale Claims Account in the State  
14     General Fund. Money for the Account must be provided by direct  
15     legislative appropriation.

16     3. Upon the approval of a stale claim ~~as provided in this  
17     section,~~ *pursuant to subsection 4,* the claim must be paid from the  
18     Stale Claims Account. Payments of *such* stale claims for a state  
19     agency must not exceed ~~H~~:

20     (a) *If the claim was eligible to be paid from money that was  
21     appropriated, the* amount of money reverted to the fund from which  
22     appropriated by the state agency for the fiscal year in which the  
23     obligations represented by the stale claims were incurred ~~H~~; or

24     (b) *If the claim was eligible to be paid from money that was  
25     authorized, the balance on the last day of the fiscal year of money  
26     that the state agency was authorized to expend during the fiscal  
27     year.*

28     4. ~~H~~ *Except as otherwise provided in this section, a* stale  
29     claim must be approved for payment from the Stale Claims Account  
30     by the State Board of Examiners. ~~, except that the~~ *The* State  
31     Board of Examiners may authorize its Clerk ~~H~~ *or a person  
32     designated by the Clerk,* under such circumstances as it deems  
33     appropriate, to approve stale claims on behalf of the Board. A state  
34     agency that is aggrieved by a determination of the Clerk *or the  
35     person designated by the Clerk* to deny all or any part of a stale  
36     claim may appeal that determination to the State Board of  
37     Examiners.

38     5. A stale claim may be approved and paid at any time, despite  
39     the age of the claim, if payable from available federal grants or from  
40     a permanent fund in the State Treasury other than the State General  
41     Fund.

14      Sec. 2. NRS 353.264 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15      353.264 1. The Reserve for Statutory Contingency Account  
16 is hereby created in the State General Fund.

17      2. The State Board of Examiners shall administer the Reserve  
18 for Statutory Contingency Account. The money in the Account must  
19 be expended only for:

20       (a) The payment of claims which are obligations of the State  
21 pursuant to NRS 41.03435, 41.0347, 621.025, 176.485, 179.310,  
22 212.040, 212.050, 212.070, 281.174, 282.290, 282.315, 288.203,  
23 293.253, 293.405, 353.120, 353.262, 412.154 and 475.235;

24       (b) The payment of claims which are obligations of the State  
25 pursuant to:

26           (1) Chapter 472 of NRS arising from operations of the  
27 Division of Forestry of the State Department of Conservation and  
28 Natural Resources directly involving the protection of life and  
29 property; and

30           (2) NRS 7.155, 34.750, 176A.640, 179.225 and 213.153,  
31 except that claims may be approved for the respective purposes  
32 listed in this paragraph only when the money otherwise appropriated  
33 for those purposes has been exhausted;

34       (c) The payment of claims which are obligations of the State  
35 pursuant to NRS 41.0349 and 41.037, but only to the extent that the  
36 money in the Fund for Insurance Premiums is insufficient to pay the  
37 claims; and

38       (d) The payment of claims which are obligations of the State  
39 pursuant to NRS 535.030 arising from remedial actions taken by the  
40 State Engineer when the condition of a dam becomes dangerous to  
41 the safety of life or property.

42      3. The State Board of Examiners may authorize its Clerk ~~or~~  
43 **a person designated by the Clerk**, under such circumstances as it  
44 deems appropriate, to approve, on behalf of the Board, the payment  
45 of claims from the Reserve for Statutory Contingency Account. For

1 the purpose of exercising any authority granted to the Clerk of the  
2 State Board of Examiners *or to the person designated by the Clerk*  
3 pursuant to this subsection, any statutory reference to the State  
4 Board of Examiners relating to such a claim shall be deemed to refer  
5 to the Clerk of the Board ~~H~~ *or the person designated by the Clerk.*
