SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing prescription labels. (BDR 54-648)

AN ACT relating to pharmacy; revising provisions authorizing a pharmacist or practitioner to indicate on a prescription label if a generic drug has been substituted for a drug prescribed by brand name; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law authorizes a pharmacist or practitioner to indicate on the label of a
2 prescription that a generic drug has been substituted for a drug prescribed by brand
3 name unless the indication is prohibited by the practitioner who prescribed the
4 drug. (NRS 639.2587) This bill requires such an indication the first time that the
5 generic drug is substituted for a drug prescribed by brand name unless the person
6 for whom the drug is dispensed elects not to have such an indication written or
7 typed on the label.



THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 639.2587 is hereby amended to read as follows:

639.2587 If a generic drug is substituted for a drug prescribed by brand name, the pharmacist or practitioner ~~†~~

~~1. Shall note† shall:~~

1. Note the name of the manufacturer, packer or distributor of the drug actually dispensed on the prescription; and

~~2. Unless prohibited by the practitioner, may indicate†~~

Indicate the substitution by writing or typing on the label the words “substituted for ~~†~~,” **or substantially similar language**, following the generic name and preceding the brand name of the drug ~~†~~ **unless the person for whom the drug is dispensed elects not to have such an indication written or typed on the label. The provisions of this subsection apply only to the initial substitution of the generic drug for a drug prescribed by brand name.**

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013.
