ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION—Expressing the support of the Nevada Legislature for the designation of the Upper Las Vegas Wash as a national monument.

1 WHEREAS, The Upper Las Vegas Wash contains thousands of  
2 Pleistocene mammal fossils of national importance, including  
3 Columbian mammoth, ground sloth, American lion, camel and horse  
4 fossils; and

5 WHEREAS, Since 1933, the Upper Las Vegas Wash has been  
6 valued by scientists because of the significant paleontological fossils  
7 demonstrative of the Pleistocene epoch, commonly referred to as the  
8 Ice Age, that are located in the area; and

9 WHEREAS, In 2004, during the preparation of the Las Vegas  
10 Valley Disposal Boundary Final Environmental Impact Statement,  
11 the Bureau of Land Management identified sensitive biological,  
12 cultural and paleontological resources determined to be worthy of  
13 more evaluation with respect to the protective status of the  
14 resources; and

15 WHEREAS, The harsh desert environment of the Upper Las  
16 Vegas Wash supports unique and imperiled plants, including the Las  
17 Vegas buckwheat, Merriam's bearpoppy, Las Vegas bearpoppy, the  
18 halfring milkvetch, Joshua trees and several species of cacti; and

1        WHEREAS, The Upper Las Vegas Wash provides important  
2 habitat for the threatened desert tortoise, endemic poppy bees, kit  
3 foxes, burrowing owls and a variety of reptiles; and

4        WHEREAS, In 2010, a National Park Service reconnaissance  
5 survey of the area determined that the area likely contains the largest  
6 continuous section of Pleistocene strata in the desert southwest; and

7        WHEREAS, The Upper Las Vegas Wash is significant to the  
8 culture and history of the native and indigenous people of the area,  
9 including the Southern Paiute Tribe; and

10      WHEREAS, Despite the findings and recommendations of the  
11 aforementioned Environmental Impact Statement and  
12 reconnaissance survey, the Upper Las Vegas Wash remains  
13 inadequately protected; and

14      WHEREAS, Many irreplaceable fossil specimens in the Upper  
15 Las Vegas Wash have been lost to vandalism or theft; and

16      WHEREAS, Designation of the Upper Las Vegas Wash site as a  
17 national monument would protect the unique resources of the area  
18 for present and future generations while allowing for public  
19 education and continued scientific research opportunities; now,  
20 therefore, be it

21      RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY AND SENATE OF THE STATE OF  
22 NEVADA, JOINTLY, That the members of the 77th Session of the  
23 Nevada Legislature hereby recognize that the Upper Las Vegas  
24 Wash contains unique, nationally important biological, cultural and  
25 paleontological resources; and be it further

26      RESOLVED, That to conserve, protect, interpret and enhance for  
27 the benefit of present and future generations these unique and  
28 nationally important resources, the Nevada Legislature expresses its  
29 support for the designation of the Upper Las Vegas Wash site as a  
30 national monument; and be it further

31      RESOLVED, That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly prepare and  
32 transmit a copy of this resolution to the Vice President of the United  
33 States as the presiding officer of the United States Senate, the  
34 Speaker of the House of Representatives, each member of the  
35 Nevada Congressional Delegation, the Governor and the Director of  
36 the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, and to  
37 the Director of the Department of Wildlife for distribution to the  
38 various conservation groups that have participated in the effort to  
39 designate the Upper Las Vegas Wash site as a national monument;  
40 and be it further

41      RESOLVED, That this resolution becomes effective upon  
42 passage.
