AN ACT relating to mammography; requiring a **statement of the density of the patient's breasts and a notice prescribed by the State Board of Health** regarding breast density to be included in a report provided to a patient; authorizing an administrative fine for failure to ~~provide comply with such notice, requirements;~~ and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Under federal law, a facility that performs a mammogram must provide directly to each patient a summary report describing the results of the mammogram written in terms that are easily understood by a lay person. (42 U.S.C. § 263b) Existing state law imposes certain requirements on the operation of a machine used to perform mammography and further provides for the imposition of an administrative fine for operation in violation of those requirements. (NRS 457.182-457.187) This bill requires the owner, lessee or other person responsible for the radiation machine for mammography that was used to perform a mammogram to ensure that the summary report required by federal law includes a statement of the density of the patient's breasts and a notice ~~encouraging the patient to discuss the notice with his or her physician or other provider of health care,~~ **prescribed by the State Board of Health that includes certain information relating to breast density, breast cancer and the impact of breast density on the effectiveness of mammography.** In addition, this bill authorizes the Health Division of the Department of Health and Human Services to impose an administrative fine for failure to provide such notice. (NRS 457.187)

1 WHEREAS, Forty percent of women have dense breast tissue; and
2 WHEREAS, Breast density is one of the strongest predictors of the failure of
3 mammography to detect cancer; and
4 WHEREAS, Breast density is a greater risk factor for breast cancer than having
5 two first degree relatives with breast cancer; and
6 WHEREAS, The vast majority of women are unaware of the density of their
7 breasts; and
8 WHEREAS, Less than 1 in 10 women with dense breast tissue learn about their
9 dense breast tissue from their doctors; and
10 WHEREAS, Several states, including Connecticut, Texas, Virginia, New York,
11 and California, have enacted legislation relating to notification of breast density;
12 now, therefore,]

13 THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
14 SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

15 **Section 1.** Chapter 457 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
16 section to read as follows:

17 **1. If a patient undergoes mammography, the owner, lessee or other person
18 responsible for the radiation machine for mammography that was used to
19 perform the mammography must ensure that each report provided to the patient
20 pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 263b(f)(1)(G)(ii)(IV) includes, without limitation, a
21 statement of the category of the patient's breast density which is determined
22 based on the Breast Imaging Reporting and Database System or [subsequent
23 such other guidelines established by the American College of Radiology, or its
24 successor organization,] as required by the State Board of Health by regulation,
25 and [the following] the notice]**

26 **[The information about the results of your mammography report in
27 relation to the density of your breast tissue is provided to you to raise your
28 awareness. Dense breast tissue is common and not abnormal. As breast
29 density increases, the ability of a mammogram to identify cancer or
30 suspicious abnormalities decreases, which may increase the risk of breast
31 cancer not being detected until a later stage. Density may change over
32 time and generally diminishes with age, but varies by person. Many
33 factors affect a person's risk of developing breast cancer, including
34 family history, personal medical history, smoking and according to some
35 studies, increased breast density. Use this letter when you speak with your
36 physician or other provider of health care about your own individual risk
37 factors for breast cancer. At that time, ask your physician or other
38 provider of health care if further testing might be useful.]**

39 **[prescribed by the State Board of Health pursuant to subsection 2.]**

40 **2. The State Board of Health shall prescribe by regulation the notice to be
41 included in a report pursuant to subsection 1. The notice must include:**

42 **(a) A statement regarding the benefits, risks and limitations of
43 mammograms;**

44 **(b) A description of factors that may affect the accuracy of a mammogram,
45 including, without limitation, the density of breast tissue or the presence of breast
46 implants;**

47 **(c) A statement that encourages the patient to discuss with his or her
48 provider of health care the patient's specific risk factors for developing breast
49 cancer; and**

1 (d) A statement that encourages the patient to discuss with his or her
2 provider of health care whether the patient should adjust his or her schedule for
3 mammograms or consider other appropriate screening options as a result of the
4 patient's breast density.

5 3. The notice prescribed by regulation pursuant to subsection 2 may
6 include, without limitation:

7 (a) A statement regarding the prevalence of dense breast tissue, the
8 relationship between breast density and breast cancer and the manner in which
9 breast density may change over time; and

10 (b) A description of the factors that affect the risk of developing breast
11 cancer.

12 4. Nothing in this section shall be construed to:

13 (a) Create a duty of care or other legal obligation beyond the duty to provide
14 the notice as set forth in this section.

15 (b) Require a notice to be provided to a patient that is inconsistent with the
16 notice required by the provisions of 42 U.S.C. § 263b or any regulations
17 promulgated pursuant thereto.

18 Sec. 2. NRS 457.182 is hereby amended to read as follows:

19 457.182 As used in NRS 457.182 to 457.187, inclusive, **and section 1 of this**
20 **act,** unless the context otherwise requires:

21 1. "Mammography" means radiography of the breast to enable a physician to
22 determine the presence, size, location and extent of cancerous or potentially
23 cancerous tissue in the breast.

24 2. "Radiation" means radiant energy which exceeds normal background levels
25 and which is used in radiography.

26 3. "Radiography" means the making of a film or other record of an internal
27 structure of the body by passing X rays or gamma rays through the body to act on
28 film or other receptor of images.

29 Sec. 3. NRS 457.187 is hereby amended to read as follows:

30 457.187 1. The Health Division may impose an administrative fine, not to
31 exceed \$5,000, against the owner, lessee or other person responsible for a radiation
32 machine for mammography for a violation of the provisions of NRS 457.182 to
33 457.186, inclusive, **and section 1 of this act,** or for a violation of a regulation
34 adopted pursuant thereto.

35 2. Any money collected as a result of an administrative fine imposed pursuant
36 to subsection 1 must be deposited in the State General Fund.

37 Sec. 4. **On or before January 1, 2014, the State Board of Health shall**
38 **adopt the regulations required by section 1 of this act.**

39 Sec. 5. **This act becomes effective upon passage and approval for the**
40 **purpose of adopting regulations and any other preparatory administrative**
41 **tasks and on January 1, 2014, for all other purposes.**
