AN ACT relating to license plates; requiring all special license plates designed, prepared and issued after **July** **October** 1, 2013, to have a uniform design and background color; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law authorizes the Department of Motor Vehicles to design, prepare and issue special license plates that have been approved by the Commission on Special License Plates or the Legislature. (NRS 482.367002, 482.367008) This bill requires that all special license plates designed, prepared and issued by the Department on or after **July** **October** 1, 2013, have a uniform design and background color.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 482.270 is hereby amended to read as follows:2 482.270 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section or by specific
3 statute, the Director shall order the redesign and preparation of motor vehicle
4 license plates with colors that are predominately blue and silver. The Director may
5 substitute white in place of silver when no suitable material is available.6 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, the Department shall, upon
7 the payment of all applicable fees, issue redesigned motor vehicle license plates
8 pursuant to this section to persons who apply for the registration or renewal of the
9 registration of a motor vehicle on or after January 1, 2001.10 3. The Department shall not issue redesigned motor vehicle license plates
11 pursuant to this section to a person who was issued motor vehicle license plates
12 before January 1, 1982, or pursuant to NRS 482.3747, 482.3763, 482.3775, 482.378
13 or 482.379, without the approval of the person.

1 4. The Director may determine and vary the size, shape and form and the
2 material of which license plates are made, but each license plate must be of
3 sufficient size to be plainly readable from a distance of 100 feet during daylight. All
4 license plates must be treated to reflect light and to be at least 100 times brighter
5 than conventional painted number plates. When properly mounted on an unlighted
6 vehicle, the license plates, when viewed from a vehicle equipped with standard
7 headlights, must be visible for a distance of not less than 1,500 feet and readable for
8 a distance of not less than 110 feet.

9 5. Every license plate must have displayed upon it:

10 (a) The registration number, or combination of letters and numbers, assigned to
11 the vehicle and to the owner thereof;

12 (b) The name of this State, which may be abbreviated;

13 (c) If issued for a calendar year, the year; and

14 (d) If issued for a registration period other than a calendar year, the month and
15 year the registration expires.

16 6. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 482.379, all letters and numbers must
17 be of the same size.

18 7. Each special license plate that is designed, prepared and issued ~~in pursuant to~~
19 ~~NRS 482.367002~~ by the Department must be designed and prepared in such a
20 manner that:

21 (a) The left-hand one-third of the plate is the only part of the plate on which is
22 displayed any design or other insignia that is suggested pursuant to paragraph (e) of
23 subsection 2 of ~~that section; and~~ **NRS 482.367002**;

24 (b) The remainder of the plate conforms to the requirements for coloring,
25 lettering and design that are set forth in this section ~~H~~; and

26 (c) *All special license plates designed, prepared and issued by the
27 Department on or after July October 1, 2013, have a uniform design and
28 background color.*

29 *8. As used in this section, "special license plate" has the meaning ascribed
30 to it in subsection 1 of NRS 482.367008.*

31 Sec. 2. 1. The amendatory provisions of this act do not apply to a special
32 license plate designed, prepared or issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles
33 before ~~July~~ October 1, 2013.

34 2. As used in this section, "special license plate" has the meaning ascribed to
35 it in subsection 1 of NRS 482.367008.
