SUMMARY—Establishes a pilot program for the administration of mental health screenings to pupils enrolled in selected secondary schools in the Clark County School District and the Washoe County School District. (BDR S-1022)

AN ACT relating to education; establishing a pilot program in the Clark County School District and the Washoe County School District for the administration of mental health screenings to pupils enrolled in selected secondary schools within each school district; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 This bill establishes a pilot program in the Clark County School District and the Washoe  
2 County School District for the administration of mental health screenings to pupils enrolled in  
3 at least one secondary school within each school district.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby established a pilot program in the Clark  
2 County School District and the Washoe County School District. For purposes of the  
3 pilot program, the board of trustees of the Clark County School District and the  
4 board of trustees of the Washoe County School District shall each:

5 (a) Identify and coordinate with interested stakeholders in the community to  
6 implement the pilot program ~~including, without limitation, universities and~~  
7 ~~colleges, local mental health professionals and medical professionals, juvenile and~~  
8 ~~family courts within the county, persons who are involved in the provision of~~  
9 ~~juvenile justice services, charitable organizations and child welfare agencies.~~

10 (b) With the input and coordination of the interested stakeholders identified  
11 pursuant to paragraph (a), provide for the administration of mental health  
12 screenings to pupils enrolled in at least one secondary school within the school  
13 district, as selected by the school district.

1 (c) With the input and coordination of the interested stakeholders identified  
2 pursuant to paragraph (a), provide an age-appropriate, professionally recognized  
3 mental health screening for administration to the pupils enrolled in each secondary  
4 school selected for the pilot program.

5 (d) Assist the principal of each secondary school selected for the pilot program  
6 with identifying professionally qualified persons, including the interested  
7 stakeholders identified pursuant to paragraph (a), to administer the mental health  
8 screenings to pupils and to conduct follow-up screenings if a pupil scores in a range  
9 which indicates that he or she may have a mental health issue.

10 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, each secondary school  
11 selected for the pilot program shall provide for the administration of the mental  
12 health screening selected by the school district by qualified persons, including the  
13 interested stakeholders identified pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection 1, to the  
14 pupils enrolled in the secondary school or to pupils enrolled in selected grades at  
15 the secondary school, as determined by the school district. The school district shall  
16 ensure that if a pupil is absent or otherwise not available on the day scheduled for  
17 administration of the mental health screenings, a make-up administration is  
18 scheduled for the pupil within a reasonable time period.

19 3. Before administration of the mental health screening to a pupil pursuant to  
20 subsection 2, the principal of the secondary school shall provide advance written  
21 notice of the screening to the parent or guardian of the pupil, including a form for  
22 consent or exemption. The notice must inform the parent or guardian of his or her  
23 right to consent to the screening or exempt the pupil from the screening and contain  
24 a form for the signature of the parent or guardian to consent to the screening or  
25 exempt the pupil from the screening. If a form exempting a pupil from the  
26 screening is signed by the parent or guardian and returned to the school, the  
27 principal must exempt the pupil and the pupil must not undergo the mental health  
28 screening. If a form is not returned on behalf of a pupil, the principal of the school  
29 must exempt the pupil and the pupil must not undergo the mental health screening.

30 4. If a pupil scores on a mental health screening administered pursuant to  
31 subsection 2 in a range which indicates the pupil may have a mental health issue,  
32 the school district shall provide the parent or guardian of the pupil with the results  
33 of the mental health screening, to the extent feasible, and a list of resources  
34 available in the county to assist the parent or guardian with obtaining appropriate  
35 further professional diagnosis and, if necessary, treatment for the pupil. The school  
36 district is not responsible for providing to such a pupil, or ensuring that such a pupil  
37 receives, further professional diagnosis or treatment.

38 **Sec. 2.** 1. On or before April 1, 2014, the Clark County School District and  
39 the Washoe County School District shall provide a report to the Legislative  
40 Committee on Education concerning the status of the implementation of the pilot  
41 program for mental health screenings required by section 1 of this act.

42 2. On or before December 1, 2014, the Clark County School District and the  
43 Washoe County School District shall each submit a report to the Department of  
44 Education which includes, without limitation, and except as otherwise provided in  
45 subsection 3:

46 (a) The number of secondary schools in the school district selected for the pilot  
47 program;

48 (b) The number of pupils in each grade level of the secondary school selected  
49 for the pilot program and the actual number of pupils who underwent mental health  
50 screenings pursuant to the pilot program;

51 (c) The number of pupils who did not undergo a mental health screening based  
52 upon the number of pupils whose parents or guardians opted out of administering

1 the mental health screening to the pupil and the number of pupils for whom a form  
2 was not returned pursuant to subsection 3 of section 1 of this act;

3 (d) The number of pupils who scored in a range indicating that the pupil may  
4 have a mental health issue and a description of the types of resources which were  
5 referred to the parent or guardian of the pupil;

6 (e) If available, an indication of how many parents and guardians followed up  
7 by seeking professional help for further diagnosis and, if necessary, treatment for  
8 the pupil; **and**

9 (f) An evaluation of whether the pilot program was useful in identifying pupils  
10 with possible mental health issues and assisting the parents and guardians of those  
11 pupils with obtaining appropriate professional diagnosis and treatment. ~~f. and~~

12 ~~(g) Recommendations for expanding the number of schools that participate in a~~  
13 ~~program of mental health screenings for pupils if the Legislature determines to~~  
14 ~~continue and expand the program.]~~

15 3. The information required by the report pursuant to subsection 2 must be  
16 provided in an aggregated format and if any of the information would reveal the  
17 individual identity of a pupil, the school district shall not include that information in  
18 the report.

19 4. On or before January 1, 2015, the Department of Education shall compile  
20 each report received pursuant to subsection 2 and submit the written compilation,  
21 including, without limitation, recommendations for continuing and expanding the  
22 pilot program for mental health screenings to pupils, to the Director of the  
23 Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the 78th Session of the Nevada  
24 Legislature.

25 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013.
