SUMMARY—Requires a cooling-off period before a former State Legislator may serve as a paid lobbyist ~~before the Legislature.~~ (BDR 17-436)

AN ACT relating to the Legislature; ~~prohibiting~~ **requiring a cooling-off period before** a former State Legislator ~~from receiving compensation or other consideration to~~ **may** serve as a **paid** lobbyist ~~to~~ **before** the Legislature ~~for a period of 2 years after leaving office;~~ **; providing for certain exceptions; providing penalties;** and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 ~~This bill prohibits~~ The Nevada Lobbying Disclosure Act regulates lobbying before
2 the Legislature and is administered by the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau.
3 (Chapter 218H of NRS) Certain violations of the Lobbying Act are punishable as
4 misdemeanors. (NRS 218H.960)

5 Under the Lobbying Act, a paid lobbyist is a person who receives any compensation
6 to: (1) appear in person in the Legislative Building or any other building in which the
7 Legislature or any of its standing committees hold meetings; and (2) communicate
8 directly with a member of the Legislative Branch on behalf of someone other than
9 himself or herself to influence legislative action. (NRS 218H.080, 218H.500)

10 However, a paid lobbyist does not include: (1) persons who confine their activities to
11 formal appearances before legislative committees and who clearly identify themselves
12 and the interest or interests for whom they are testifying; (2) employees of a bona fide
13 news medium who are acting in the course of their professional duties and news
14 gathering function; (3) certain state and local officers and employees who confine their
15 activities to matters related to their public offices or agencies; and (4) persons who
16 contact the Legislators elected from the districts in which such persons reside. (NRS
17 218H.080)

18 Section 1 of this bill amends the Lobbying Act to prohibit a former State Legislator from ~~receiving compensation or other consideration to serve~~ serving as a **paid** lobbyist ~~to~~ **before** the Legislature for ~~2 years after leaving office;~~ **a cooling-off period beginning on the date on which the former Legislator leaves office as a member of the Legislature and ending on the date after the final adjournment of the next regular session during which the former Legislator is not a member of the Legislature.**

19 Section 2 of this bill prohibits a former State Legislator from filing a registration
20 statement with the Director in the classification of a paid lobbyist during the cooling-off
21 period. (NRS 218H.200)

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27 Section 3 of this bill makes violations of the cooling-off period punishable as
28 misdemeanors. (NRS 218H.960)

29 Section 4 of this bill provides that the cooling-off period applies only to a person who
30 is elected to office as a State Legislator for a term commencing on or after November 4,
31 2014, or a person who is appointed to serve the remainder of such an unexpired term.

32 Section 5 of this bill provides that the provisions of this bill become effective on
33 November 4, 2014.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter ~~218A~~ 218H of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 1. A former Legislator shall not receive compensation or other
4 consideration to serve as a lobbyist for [a period of 2 years after leaving office],
5 the period beginning on the date on which the former Legislator leaves office as a
6 member of the Legislature and ending on the date after the final adjournment of
7 the next regular session during which the former Legislator is not a member of
8 the Legislature.

9 2. As used in this section:

10 (a) "Consideration"], "consideration" means a gift, salary, payment,
11 distribution, loan, advance or deposit of money or anything of value and
12 includes, without limitation, a contract, promise or agreement, whether or not
13 legally enforceable.

14 (b) "Lobbyist" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 218H.080.]

15 **Sec. 2. NRS 218H.200 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

16 218H.200 1. Every person who acts as a lobbyist shall, not later than 2 days
17 after the beginning of that activity, file a registration statement with the Director in
18 such form as the Director prescribes.

19 2. A former Legislator shall not file a registration statement with the
20 Director in the classification of a lobbyist who receives any compensation for his
21 or her lobbying activities during any period in which the former Legislator is
22 prohibited from serving as such a lobbyist pursuant to section 1 of this act.

23 **Sec. 3. NRS 218H.960 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

24 218H.960 A person who is subject to any provision in NRS 218H.900 or
25 218H.930 or section 1 of this act and who violates or otherwise refuses or fails to
26 comply with the provision is guilty of a misdemeanor.

27 **Sec. 4. This act applies only to a person who is elected to office as a State**
28 **Legislator for a term commencing on or after November 4, 2014, or a person**
29 **who is appointed to serve the remainder of such an unexpired term.**

30 **Sec. 5. This act becomes effective on November 4, 2014.**
