SUMMARY—Revises the period of limitation for crimes relating to the sexual abuse of a child. (BDR 14-177)

AN ACT relating to crimes; revising the period of limitation for crimes relating to the sexual abuse of a child; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 Existing law establishes certain periods of limitation for crimes relating to the
2 sexual abuse of a child which require that an indictment be found or an information
3 or complaint be filed before the victim of the sexual abuse of a child is: (1) 21 years
4 old if the victim discovers or reasonably should have discovered that he or she was
5 a victim of the sexual abuse by the date on which the victim reaches 21 years of
6 age; or (2) 28 years old if the victim does not discover and reasonably should not
7 have discovered that he or she was a victim of the sexual abuse by the date on
8 which the victim reaches 21 years of age. (NRS 171.095) This bill provides that an
9 indictment must be found or an information or complaint must be filed before the
10 victim of the sexual abuse of a child is: (1) 36 years old if the victim discovers or
11 reasonably should have discovered that he or she was a victim of the sexual abuse
12 by the date on which the victim reaches 36 years of age; or (2) 43 years old if the
13 victim does not discover and reasonably should not have discovered that he or she
14 was a victim of the sexual abuse by the date on which the victim reaches 36 years
15 of age.

1 (a) If a felony, gross misdemeanor or misdemeanor is committed
2 in a secret manner, an indictment for the offense must be found, or
3 an information or complaint filed, within the periods of limitation
4 prescribed in NRS 171.085, 171.090 and 624.800 after the discovery
5 of the offense, unless a longer period is allowed by paragraph (b) or
6 (c) or the provisions of NRS 202.885.

7 (b) An indictment must be found, or an information or
8 complaint filed, for any offense constituting sexual abuse of a child,
9 as defined in NRS 432B.100, before the victim of the sexual abuse
10 is:

11 (1) ~~Twenty-one~~ *Thirty-six* years old if the victim discovers
12 or reasonably should have discovered that he or she was a victim of
13 the sexual abuse by the date on which the victim reaches that age; or

14 (2) ~~Twenty-eight~~ *Forty-three* years old if the victim does
15 not discover and reasonably should not have discovered that he or
16 she was a victim of the sexual abuse by the date on which the victim
17 reaches ~~21~~ *36* years of age.

18 (c) If a felony is committed pursuant to NRS 205.461 to
19 205.4657, inclusive, against a victim who is less than 18 years of
20 age at the time of the commission of the offense, an indictment for
21 the offense must be found, or an information or complaint filed,
22 within 4 years after the victim discovers or reasonably should have
23 discovered the offense.

24 2. If any indictment found, or an information or complaint
25 filed, within the time prescribed in subsection 1 is defective so that
26 no judgment can be given thereon, another prosecution may be
27 instituted for the same offense within 6 months after the first is
28 abandoned.

29 **Sec. 4.** The amendatory provisions of this act apply to a person
30 who:

31 1. Committed the sexual abuse of a child, as defined in NRS
32 432B.100, before October 1, 2013, if the applicable period of
33 limitation has commenced but has not yet expired on October 1,
34 2013.

35 2. Commits the sexual abuse of a child, as defined in NRS
36 432B.100, on or after October 1, 2013.
