SUMMARY—Creates the Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual Abuse of Children. (BDR 38-192)

AN ACT relating to the protection of children; creating the Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual Abuse of Children within the Division of Child and Family Services of the Department of Health and Human Services; requiring the Task Force to perform certain duties; providing for the expiration of the Task Force; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 The Division of Child and Family Services of the Department of Health and
2 Human Services administers, coordinates and provides child welfare services in this
3 State. (NRS 432B.180) **Section 2** of this bill creates the Task Force on the
4 Prevention of Sexual Abuse of Children within the Division. **Section 3** of this bill
5 establishes certain procedures governing the Task Force. **Section 4** of this bill
6 authorizes the Task Force to recommend a policy that includes educating certain
7 persons who are associated with children about the sexual abuse of children, and
8 providing support services to children in this State who may be affected by sexual
9 abuse. **Section 5** of this bill: (1) requires the Task Force to provide to the Governor
10 and the Legislature recommendations, in the form of a report, to reduce the sexual
11 abuse of children in this State; (2) sets a deadline for the submission of the report;
12 (3) requires the Task Force to seek information from certain agencies, organizations
13 and persons in compiling the required recommendations; and (4) requires the Task



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14 Force to recommend goals for policy to prevent the sexual abuse of children in this
15 State. **Section 6** of this bill provides for the expiration of the Task Force.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 432B of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 5, inclusive, of this
3 act.

4 **Sec. 2. 1. The Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual**
5 **Abuse of Children is hereby created within the Division of Child**
6 **and Family Services.**

7 **2. The Task Force consists of 15 members as follows:**

8 **(a) One member of the Senate and one member of the public,**
9 **each appointed by the Majority Leader of the Senate;**

10 **(b) One member of the Senate and one member of the public,**
11 **each appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate;**

12 **(c) One member of the Assembly and one member of the**
13 **public, each appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly;**

14 **(d) One member of the Assembly and one member of the**
15 **public, each appointed by the Minority Leader of the Assembly;**

16 **(e) The Administrator of the Division of Child and Family**
17 **Services or the designee of the Administrator;**

18 **(f) The Superintendent of Public Instruction or the designee of**
19 **the Superintendent;**

20 **(g) The Attorney General or the designee of the Attorney**
21 **General;**

22 **(h) A representative of an agency that is involved in the**
23 **investigation, prosecution and treatment of cases of the sexual**
24 **abuse of children in this State, appointed by the Administrator of**
25 **the Division of Child and Family Services;**

26 **(i) Two representatives of different statewide organizations of**
27 **professional teachers, each appointed by the head of his or her**
28 **organization, with the organizations of professional teachers to be**
29 **chosen by the Superintendent of Public Instruction; and**

30 **(j) A representative of an organization involved in the**
31 **prevention of the sexual abuse of children in this State, appointed**
32 **by the Administrator of the Division of Child and Family Services.**

33 **3. Each member of the Task Force must be involved actively**
34 **in one or more aspects of the prevention of the sexual abuse of**
35 **children and the promotion of child welfare in this State.**

36 **Sec. 3. 1. The members of the Task Force on the**
37 **Prevention of Sexual Abuse of Children shall, by a majority vote,**
38 **elect a Chair and a Vice Chair from among their number.**



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1 2. *The members of the Task Force shall meet at the call of
2 the Chair. The Task Force shall prescribe rules for its
3 management and government.*

4 3. *A majority of the members of the Task Force constitutes a
5 quorum, and a quorum may exercise all the powers conferred on
6 the Task Force.*

7 4. *The members of the Task Force serve without
8 compensation.*

9 5. *Vacancies on the Task Force must be filled in the same
10 manner as original appointments.*

11 6. *The Administrator of the Division of Child and Family
12 Services shall provide the Task Force with administrative support.*

13 7. *The Task Force shall comply with the provisions of
14 chapter 241 of NRS.*

15 Sec. 4. 1. *The Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual
16 Abuse of Children may recommend a policy addressing the sexual
17 abuse of children in this State that may include, without
18 limitation:*

19 (a) *Age-appropriate curriculum for pupils in prekindergarten
20 through grade 5;*

21 (b) *Training for school personnel;*

22 (c) *Providing educational information in school handbooks,
23 pamphlets and other materials, for parents and guardians,
24 including, without limitation:*

25 (1) *The warning signs of sexual abuse of children; and*

26 (2) *Assistance, referral or information concerning
27 resources; and*

28 (d) *The provision of:*

29 (1) *Counseling and other resources available to any child
30 in this State affected by sexual abuse; and*

31 (2) *Emotional and educational support for any child in this
32 State who has experienced sexual abuse, to allow the child to
33 succeed in school.*

34 2. *Any policy recommended pursuant to this section may
35 address, without limitation:*

36 (a) *Methods to increase awareness in teachers, students and
37 parents of issues regarding the sexual abuse of children,
38 including, without limitation, warning signs that a child might be
39 a victim of sexual abuse;*

40 (b) *Actions that a child who is the victim of sexual abuse can
41 take to obtain assistance and intervention; and*

42 (c) *Counseling options available for students affected by
43 sexual abuse.*

44 Sec. 5. 1. *The Task Force on the Prevention of Sexual
45 Abuse of Children shall recommend to the Governor and the*



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1 *Legislature measures intended to reduce the incidence of the*
2 *sexual abuse of children in this State. The Task Force may*
3 *recommend, without limitation, specific legislation and methods to*
4 *foster cooperation among state agencies and between the State*
5 *and local governments. The Task Force shall, not later than*
6 *June 30, 2014, submit a final report of its recommendations to the*
7 *Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmission to the*
8 *Governor and the next regular session of the Nevada Legislature.*

9 2. *In exercising the duties prescribed in subsection 1, the*
10 *Task Force shall:*

11 (a) *Gather information concerning the sexual abuse of*
12 *children in this State;*

13 (b) *Receive reports and testimony from persons, State and*
14 *local governmental entities, community-based organizations and*
15 *other public and private organizations;*

16 (c) *Consult with employees of the Division of Child and*
17 *Family Services, the Department of Public Safety, the Department*
18 *of Education and any other state agency or department as*
19 *necessary to accomplish the duties of the Task Force; and*

20 (d) *Recommend goals and policies to prevent the sexual abuse*
21 *of children in this State.*

22 Sec. 6. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013, and expires
23 by limitation on July 1, 2014.

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
