SUMMARY—Authorizes Legislators to designate that compensation be deposited in the State Distributive School Account. (BDR 17-856)

AN ACT relating to Legislators; authorizing each Legislator to designate that any portion of the compensation he or she is entitled to receive during a regular or special session of the Legislature be deposited in the State Distributive School Account; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law provides that the members of the Legislature shall receive for their
2 services compensation of \$130 per day for the first: (1) 60 days of service during
3 any regular session of the Legislature; and (2) 20 days of service during any special
4 session. (Nev. Const. Art. 4, § 33; NRS 218A.630) This bill authorizes a Legislator
5 to designate that any portion of the compensation that he or she is entitled to
6 receive for legislative service be deposited in the State Distributive School
7 Account. This bill also provides that any money so deposited must be used to
8 augment and not replace or supplant any existing funding for education.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 218A.630 is hereby amended to read as
2 follows:
3 218A.630 1. Each Legislator is entitled to receive as
4 compensation \$130 per day for each day of service:
5 (a) During any regular session, for the number of days the
6 Legislature is in that regular session, or in adjournment for not more

1 than 3 days, or the maximum number of days for which
2 compensation for a regular session is permitted by the Constitution,
3 whichever is smaller; and

4 (b) During any special session, for the number of days the
5 Legislature is in that special session or the maximum number of
6 days for which compensation for a special session is permitted by
7 the Constitution, whichever is smaller.

8 2. On the first day of each term of a Legislator beginning on or
9 after November 8, 2006, the compensation of the office of the
10 Legislator must be increased by an amount equal to the cumulative
11 percentage increase in the salaries of the classified employees of this
12 State during the immediately preceding term of that office.

13 *3. A Legislator may designate that any portion of the
14 compensation that he or she is entitled to receive pursuant to this
15 section be deposited in the State Distributive School Account in
16 the State General Fund. Any money so deposited must be used to
17 augment and must not be used to replace or supplant any existing
18 funding for education.*
