

SENATE BILL NO. 267—SENATORS WOODHOUSE,
SPEARMAN, PARKS; FORD AND SEGERBLOM

MARCH 15, 2013

Referred to Committee on Commerce, Labor and Energy

SUMMARY—Establishes provisions governing tanning establishments. (BDR 52-958)

AN ACT relating to tanning establishments; prohibiting an owner or operator of a tanning establishment from allowing a person who is less than 18 years of age to use the tanning equipment of the establishment without first identifying and obtaining the written consent of the parent or guardian of the person; requiring an owner or operator of a tanning establishment to post certain warning signs concerning the use of tanning equipment; authorizing certain persons to bring an action against an owner or operator of a tanning establishment under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 **Section 8** of this bill prohibits an owner or operator of a tanning establishment
2 from allowing a person who is less than 18 years of age to use the tanning
3 equipment of the establishment unless the owner or operator first identifies and
4 obtains the written consent of the parent or guardian of the person.

5 **Section 9** of this bill requires an owner or operator of a tanning establishment
6 to post a notice in a conspicuous place informing customers of certain requirements
7 set forth in **section 8**, and of certain health risks associated with the use of tanning
8 equipment. **Section 10** of this bill requires an owner or operator of a tanning
9 establishment to post in a conspicuous place in each area where tanning equipment
10 is used a warning sign informing users of certain safety procedures that must be
11 followed while using the tanning equipment. **Section 11** of this bill requires an
12 owner or operator of a tanning establishment to ensure that a qualified person be
13 present at the tanning establishment during operating hours and that each user be
14 aware of and use certain safety equipment. **Section 11** prohibits a person from

15 using the tanning equipment of a tanning establishment unless he or she signs a
16 statement of acknowledgment and uses protective eyewear while using the tanning
17 equipment. **Section 13** of this bill exempts from the provisions of this act any
18 physician who prescribes the use of a phototherapy device, as well as any person
19 prescribed the use of such a device by a physician.

20 **Section 12** of this bill authorizes a parent or guardian to bring an action against
21 an owner or operator who allows a child of the parent or guardian to use the tanning
22 equipment of the establishment and who does not first identify and obtain the
23 written consent of the parent or guardian. **Section 12** also provides that an owner or
24 operator of a tanning establishment is not liable in such an action if he or she
25 obtained the written consent of the parent or guardian in good faith and pursuant to
26 the procedural requirements set forth in **section 8**.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 597 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 13, inclusive, of this
3 act.

4 **Sec. 2.** *As used in sections 2 to 13, inclusive, of this act,
5 unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined
6 in sections 3 to 7, inclusive, of this act have the meanings ascribed
7 to them in those sections.*

8 **Sec. 3.** *“Operator” means a person who is designated by the
9 owner of a tanning establishment or by the lessee of the tanning
10 equipment of the tanning establishment to operate or to assist and
11 instruct in the operation and use of the tanning establishment or
12 tanning equipment.*

13 **Sec. 4.** *“Owner” means the owner of a tanning
14 establishment.*

15 **Sec. 5.** *“Phototherapy device” means any equipment that
16 emits ultraviolet radiation and is used in the diagnosis or
17 treatment of disease or injury.*

18 **Sec. 6.** *“Tanning equipment” means any device that emits
19 ultraviolet radiation to tan human skin, including, without
20 limitation, sunlamps, tanning booths and tanning beds.*

21 **Sec. 7.** *“Tanning establishment” means any premises,
22 mobile unit, building or part of a building where access to tanning
23 equipment is provided for a fee, membership dues or any other
24 compensation.*

25 **Sec. 8. 1.** *An owner or operator shall not allow a person
26 who is less than 18 years of age to use the tanning equipment of
27 the tanning establishment unless:*

28 **(a)** *A parent or guardian of the person physically appears at
29 the tanning establishment and produces a driver’s license or other*

1 form of identification issued by a governmental agency as
2 evidence of his or her identity; and

3 (b) The owner or operator obtains the written consent of the
4 parent or guardian of the person, which must include a statement
5 that he or she is a parent or guardian of the person and which
6 expressly authorizes the person to use the tanning equipment of
7 the tanning establishment.

8 2. The written consent of a parent or guardian obtained
9 by the owner or operator pursuant to subsection 1 expires 1 year
10 after the date on which it is obtained and may be renewed or
11 revoked by the parent or guardian.

12 3. The owner or operator shall maintain a copy of any written
13 consent obtained from a parent or guardian of a person who is
14 less than 18 years of age pursuant to this section for a period of
15 not less than 1 year after the most recent use of the tanning
16 equipment by the person.

17 Sec. 9. An owner or operator shall post in a conspicuous
18 place in the tanning establishment a notice that states
19 substantially the following:

20 1. It is unlawful for the owner or operator of a tanning
21 establishment to allow a person who is less than 18 years of age to
22 use any tanning equipment without first obtaining the written
23 consent of the parent or guardian of the person.

24 2. An owner or operator of a tanning establishment who
25 violates any provision of sections 2 to 13, inclusive, of this act may
26 be subject to civil action.

27 3. Any person may report a violation of sections 2 to 13,
28 inclusive, of this act to any law enforcement agency.

29 4. Health risks associated with tanning include, without
30 limitation, skin cancer, premature aging of the skin and burns to
31 the skin.

32 Sec. 10. An owner or operator shall post in a conspicuous
33 place in each area where tanning equipment is used a warning
34 sign that states substantially the following:

35 1. Follow instructions.

36 2. Avoid too frequent or too lengthy exposure. Like exposure
37 to the sun, use of tanning equipment can cause eye and skin
38 injury and allergic reactions. Repeated exposure can cause
39 chronic sun damage, which is characterized by wrinkling, dryness,
40 fragility and bruising of the skin and skin cancer.

41 3. Wear protective eyewear. Failure to do so may result in
42 severe burns or long-term injury to the eyes.

43 4. Medications and cosmetics may increase your sensitivity to
44 ultraviolet radiation. Consult a physician before using tanning

1 equipment if you are using medications, have a history of skin
2 problems or believe that you are especially sensitive to sunlight.

3 5. If your skin does not tan when exposed to the sun, it is
4 unlikely that your skin will tan when exposed to this tanning
5 equipment.

6 Sec. 11. An owner or operator shall ensure that:

7 1. A person who is qualified to operate the tanning equipment
8 and who is able to inform users about, and assist such users in,
9 the proper use of tanning equipment is present at the tanning
10 establishment during operating hours.

11 2. Tanning equipment is properly sanitized after each use.

12 3. Each user, before he or she begins to use tanning
13 equipment, is provided with properly sanitized and securely fitting
14 protective eyewear that protects the wearer's eyes from ultraviolet
15 radiation and allows enough vision to maintain balance.

16 4. Users wear the protective eyewear described in subsection
17 3 when using tanning equipment.

18 5. Each user is shown how to maintain the proper exposure
19 distance from the tanning equipment as recommended by the
20 manufacturer.

21 6. A timing device which is accurate within 10 percent of any
22 selected time interval is used and is remotely located so a user
23 cannot set his or her own exposure time when using tanning
24 equipment.

25 7. Tanning equipment is equipped with a mechanism that
26 allows the user to turn off the
27 tanning equipment.

28 8. Each user is limited to the maximum exposure time
29 recommended by the manufacturer for his or her skin type.

30 9. A user is not allowed to use the tanning equipment more
31 than once in any 24-hour period.

32 10. The interior temperature of the tanning establishment
33 does not exceed 100 degrees Fahrenheit.

34 11. Acknowledgments signed by each user or, if the user is
35 less than 18 years of age, by his or her parent or guardian,
36 indicating that he or she understands the notices and warnings
37 prescribed by sections 9 and 10, and that he or she agrees to use
38 protective eyewear, are retained for at least 3 years or until the
39 user signs a new acknowledgment.

40 Sec. 12. 1. A parent or guardian of a person who is less
41 than 18 years of age may bring an action against an owner or
42 operator if the owner or operator does not identify and obtain
43 written consent from the parent or guardian in the manner
44 prescribed by subsection 1 of section 8 of this act.

1 2. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, in any action
2 brought pursuant to this section, if a parent or guardian of a
3 person who is less than 18 years of age establishes that the owner
4 or operator did not identify and obtain written consent from the
5 parent or guardian in the manner prescribed by subsection 1 of
6 section 8 of this act, a court shall award the parent or guardian, in
7 addition to costs and attorney's fees:

8 (a) For the first occurrence, \$2,000.

9 (b) For the second or a subsequent occurrence, \$4,000.

10 3. Each instance in which an owner or operator allows a
11 person who is less than 18 years of age to use the tanning
12 equipment of the tanning establishment without identifying and
13 obtaining the consent of a parent or guardian of the person in the
14 manner prescribed by subsection 1 of section 8 of this act
15 constitutes a separate occurrence.

16 4. An owner or operator who, in good faith, complies with the
17 requirements of section 8 of this act is not liable in any action
18 brought pursuant to this section.

19 Sec. 13. The provisions of sections 2 to 13, inclusive, of this
20 act do not apply to any physician licensed to practice medicine in
21 this State who uses, or prescribes the use of, a phototherapy
22 device, or to any person who is prescribed the use of a
23 phototherapy device by a physician licensed to practice medicine
24 in this State.

25 Sec. 14. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013.
