SUMMARY—Makes various changes concerning investigations of motor vehicle accidents. (BDR 23-107)

AN ACT relating to law enforcement; requiring a law enforcement agency in certain counties to adopt policies and procedures to govern the investigation of motor vehicle accidents in which peace officers employed by the law enforcement agency are involved; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 This bill requires a law enforcement agency in a county whose population is
2 100,000 or more (currently Clark and Washoe Counties) to adopt policies and
3 procedures to govern the investigation of motor vehicle accidents in which peace
4 officers employed by the law enforcement agency are involved. The policies and
5 procedures may include entering into agreements for cooperation between the law
6 enforcement agency and agencies in other jurisdictions for the investigation of such
7 accidents.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 289 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 ***In a county whose population is 100,000 or more:***

4 ***1. Each law enforcement agency shall adopt policies and***
5 ***procedures to govern the investigation of motor vehicle accidents***
6 ***in which a peace officer employed by the law enforcement agency***
7 ***is involved.***

1 2. This section does not prohibit a law enforcement agency
2 from entering into agreements for cooperation with agencies in
3 other jurisdictions for the investigation of motor vehicle accidents
4 in which a peace officer of the law enforcement agency is
5 involved.

6 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013.
