**SUMMARY**—Requires the Commissioner of Insurance to conduct a study concerning claims, coverage and payments under policies of dental and health insurance. (BDR S-1061)

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AN ACT relating to insurance; requiring the Commissioner of Insurance to conduct a study concerning claims, coverage and payments under policies of dental and health insurance; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law authorizes the Commissioner of Insurance to conduct  
2 examinations and investigations of insurance matters. (NRS 679B.120) This bill  
3 requires the Commissioner to conduct a study concerning topics relating to claims,  
4 coverage and payments under policies of dental and health insurance, including,  
5 issues relating to the coordination of benefits for coverage of procedures, including,  
6 without limitation, oral surgery, where the patient has multiple dental or medical  
7 plans which may provide coverage and submit a report of the results of the study to  
8 the Legislative Committee on Health Care on or before June 1, 2014.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     **Section 1.** 1. The Commissioner of Insurance shall conduct  
2 a study concerning topics relating to claims, coverage and payments  
3 under policies of dental and health insurance.  
4       2. The study must include a review of:  
5           (a) The coordination of benefits for coverage of procedures,  
6 including, without limitation, oral surgery, where the patient has



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1    multiple dental plans, multiple medical plans or both dental and  
2    medical plans which may provide coverage; and

3        (b) Any other issues relating to claims, coverage or payments  
4    under policies of dental and health insurance, including, without  
5    limitation, annual limits for dental insurance benefit payouts, annual  
6    deductibles for dental insurance and the ability of health care  
7    providers, including oral surgeons, to receive timely payment for  
8    services.

9        3. On or before June 1, 2014, the Commissioner of Insurance  
10   shall submit a report of the results of the study conducted pursuant  
11   to subsection 1 and any recommendations for legislation to the  
12   Legislative Committee on Health Care.

13      **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2013.

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
