AN ACT relating to criminal procedure; directing the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice to consider certain matters relating to parole; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law establishes the Advisory Commission on the Administration of
2 Justice and directs the Commission among other duties, to identify and study the
3 elements of this State's system of criminal justice. (NRS 176.0123, 176.0125) This
4 bill requires the Advisory Commission to include, as an item on an agenda,
5 consideration of certain matters relating to parole.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** The Advisory Commission on the Administration
2 of Justice shall, at a meeting held by the Commission, include as an
3 item on the agenda a discussion of the following matters relating to
4 parole:
5 1. A survey of the parole systems of this State and other states
6 and territories of the United States.
7 2. A review of states that replaced discretionary parole systems
8 with mandatory parole systems.
9 3. A review of any other matter that the Advisory Commission
10 determines is relevant to the discussion.
