INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

By Assemblymen Kirner, Hickey, Duncan, Fiore, Grady, Hambrick, Healey, Kirkpatrick, Munford, and Stewart; Senators Hammond and Kieckhefer:

Assembly Bill No. 164—AN ACT relating to education; requiring the State Board of Education to prescribe an assessment to determine the proficiency in reading of pupils enrolled in grades 1, 2 and 3; requiring the board of trustees of each school district and the governing body of each charter school that enrolls pupils in grade 1, 2 or 3 to administer the assessment; requiring the development of an academic plan for certain pupils who exhibit a substantial deficiency in reading; prescribing the contents of the academic plan; requiring, with certain limited exceptions, the academic retention of a pupil in grade 3 if the pupil does not demonstrate reading proficiency on the assessment prescribed by the State Board; requiring the principal of a school or a person designated by the governing body of a charter school in which certain pupils are retained in the same grade to provide intervention services; requiring the board of trustees of each school district and the governing body of each charter school to submit certain reports to the Department of Education; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Kirner moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Education.

Assembly Bill No. 165—AN ACT relating to the Department of Motor Vehicles; limiting the purposes for which the Director of the Department is allowed to release certain personal information; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assembly Bill No. 166—AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; revising requirements for the registration of a motor vehicle of a nonresident who is employed in this State and operates the motor vehicle on the highways of this State; requiring that such a motor vehicle comply with certain provisions; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Carrillo moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Transportation.

Assembly Bill No. 167—AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; revising requirements for the registration of a motor vehicle that is operated on the highways of this State for a business purpose within this State; requiring that such a motor vehicle complies with certain provisions; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Carrillo moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Transportation.

Assembly Bill No. 168—AN ACT relating to wildlife; requiring the membership of each county advisory board to manage wildlife to include one qualified member who represents the interests of the general public; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblywoman Carlton moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, Agriculture, and Mining.

By Assemblymen Neal, Horne and Daly; Senator Atkinson:

Assembly Bill No. 169—AN ACT relating to public financial administration; establishing additional requirements and imposing limitations on certain contracts of State and local agencies for the performance of services; requiring such an agency to submit certain reports about its contracts to the Purchasing Division of the Department of Administration; requiring a public body which awards a contract for a public work to gather and maintain certain information about bidders and persons who apply for employment on the public work; requiring the Department of Transportation to post information about contracts between the Department and architects, engineers and other professionals; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.
