INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

By Assemblywoman Kirkpatrick:

Assembly Bill No. 498—AN ACT relating to taxation; revising provisions governing the tax on live entertainment to establish the Nevada Entertainment and Admissions Tax as an excise tax on live entertainment and admissions to places of amusement, sport, recreation or other entertainment; providing for the rate and imposition of the Nevada Entertainment and Admissions Tax; revising exemptions from the tax on live entertainment to establish certain exemptions from the Nevada Entertainment and Admissions

Tax; authorizing the Nevada Gaming Commission to adopt regulations under certain circumstances to provide for certain limited exemptions from the Nevada Entertainment and Admissions Tax; revising provisions governing investigations and the initiation of complaints by the State Gaming Control Board for violations relating to the tax on live entertainment and the Nevada Entertainment and Admissions Tax; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Horne moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Taxation.

Amendment No. 584.

SUMMARY—Makes <u>a</u>_supplemental [appropriations] <u>appropriation</u> to the Nevada Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety as reimbursement for unanticipated visiting dignitary protection assignments <u>.</u> [and for an unanticipated shortfall resulting from an increase in fuel costs.] (BDR S-1192)

AN ACT making <u>a_supplemental [appropriations]</u> to the Nevada Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety as reimbursement for unanticipated visiting dignitary protection assignments <u>:</u> [and for an unanticipated shortfall resulting from an increase in fuel costs;] and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Nevada Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety the sum of \$14,803 as reimbursement for unanticipated visiting dignitary protection assignments. This appropriation is supplemental to that made in section 28 of chapter 371, Statutes of Nevada 2011, at page 2161.
- Sec. 2. [There is hereby appropriated from the State Highway Fund to the Nevada Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety the sum of \$731,409 for an unanticipated shortfall resulting from an increase in fuel costs. This appropriation is supplemental to that made in section 30 of chapter 371, Statutes of Nevada 2011, at page 2162.] (Deleted by amendment.)

Sec. 3. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval. Assemblywoman Carlton moved the adoption of the amendment. Remarks by Assemblywoman Carlton. Amendment adopted. Bill ordered reprinted, engrossed and to third reading.
