# Seventy-Seventh Session May 10, 2013

## Chair Woodhouse:

I will open this work session with Assembly Bill (A.B.) 17.

ASSEMBLY BILL 17 (1st Reprint): Revises provisions governing the conditions under which the access of a school district employee operating a program of education for incarcerated persons at a facility or institution operated by the Department of Corrections may be restricted. (BDR 34-319)

## Pepper Sturm (Policy Analyst):

The Committee has received a work session document for this bill (<u>Exhibit C</u>). I will read from the work session document, <u>Exhibit C</u>.

## Chair Woodhouse:

ASSEMBLY BILL 205 (1st Reprint): Revises provisions governing charter schools. (BDR 34-200)

## Mr. Sturm:

The Committee has received a work session document for this bill (Exhibit D). I will read from the work session document, Exhibit D. The language in an amendment proposed by Steve Canavero will require review by the Legislative Counsel Bureau. A conceptual amendment has been proposed by Mr. Canavero to consider only the assessments of schools falling under section 3.5 of A.B. 205 for the 2013-2014 school year and subsequent school years to allow the State performance framework to be fully implemented.

This bill may potentially conflict with another bill previously heard by this Committee.

## Asher Killian (Counsel):

Under existing law, a prereview process allows the Department of Education (NDE) to prereview an application for a charter school before it goes to the sponsor for review and a decision regarding acceptance. Senate Bill (S.B.) 443, which was previously heard and passed out of this Committee, eliminated this prereview process.

**SENATE BILL 443**: Revises provisions governing charter schools. (BDR 34-079)

Provisions of <u>A.B. 205</u> potentially conflict with the elimination of the prereview created in <u>S.B. 443</u>. We proposed a technical amendment to cause <u>A.B. 205</u> to conform to the provisions of S.B. 443.

#### Mr. Sturm:

There are two amendments proposed for consideration. The first is the technical amendment addressing the conflict between the Senate and Assembly bills. The second is the conceptual amendment by Mr. Canavero.

SENATOR FORD MOVED TO AMEND AND REREFER A.B. 205 TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON FINANCE WITH THE TECHNICAL AMENDMENT AND MR. CANAVERO'S CONCEPTUAL AMENDMENT.

SENATOR KIHUEN SECONDED THE MOTION.
