MINUTES OF THE JOINT SUBCOMMITTEE ON HUMAN SERVICES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND THE ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

Seventy-Seventh Session May 10, 2013

Chair Smith:

We will hear closing budgets today for the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation (DETR) as shown on Joint Subcommittee on Human Services Closing List #8 (Exhibit C).

Mark Winebarger (Program Analyst):

The Governor recommends consolidating the Services to the Blind and Visually Impaired budget account, (B/A) 101-3254, with Vocational Rehabilitation B/A 101-3265. The transfer is outlined in decision units E-900, E-902, E-903, E-904 and E-905. This recommendation would add a total of \$8.4 million to the Vocational Rehabilitation budget over the biennium, of which \$1.2 million is General Fund.

The Agency states that the U.S. Department of Labor Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, permits agencies to combine general vocational rehabilitation services with services to blind and visually impaired consumers. The accounting and budgeting systems have remained separate. A combined agency is one that provides services to individuals who are blind as well as concurrently providing rehabilitation services to individuals with other disabilities. The Agency states that such a fiscal separation creates duplicate

work since many expenditures must be arbitrarily split between the two budget accounts which then must be reconciled, balanced and reported on individually.

The Agency provided information indicating that 24 states have agencies that serve blind/visually impaired individuals separately from general vocational rehabilitation clients. However, DETR did not specify whether these states had combined or separate fiscal management. According to DETR, the federal Rehabilitation Services Administration indicates that states where the programs are combined, funding for blind/visually impaired clients is between 12 percent and 20 percent of their total vocational rehabilitation allotment. The Legislature historically allocates 20 percent of the total federal vocational rehabilitation funding to B/A 101-3254. Consolidating the two accounts would permit DETR to decide whether to change that percentage allocation without consulting the Legislative Branch.

The Agency states that the administrative and programmatic functions were combined approximately 13 to 14 years ago, but statutes were not updated to reflect this combination and the budget accounts remained separate. According to *Nevada Revised Statute* (NRS) 232.940, the Bureau of Services to Persons Who Are Blind or Visually Impaired and the Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation are separate entities.

During the March 22 budget hearing, the Agency testified that the only change proposed was the consolidation of the two budget accounts. All programs and staff would continue to perform the same duties in their current locations.

Does the Subcommittee wish to approve the fiscal consolidation of the Services to the Blind and Visually Impaired program into the Vocational Rehabilitation budget account, thereby eliminating B/A 101-3254?

Assemblywoman Carlton:

The Subcommittee may recall discussions about this consolidation in our meeting and in the Assembly, where we heard <u>Assembly Bill (A.B.) 451</u>. There have been many consolidations and a lot of moving pieces this Session. I am not comfortable with this consolidation. I do not feel that it is necessary.

ASSEMBLY BILL 451: Consolidates the Bureau of Services to Persons Who Are Blind or Visually Impaired and the Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation within the Rehabilitation Division of the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation. (BDR 38-1163)

Chair Smith:

I need additional information on this issue.

Assemblywoman Carlton:

The Agency testified in our Subcommittee meeting that this was merely a technical change, but the public testimony that we heard in the Assembly from those who utilize these services was that they were disturbed by the changes. They were concerned about who was getting those services and how the money was being spent. The consolidation has been brought up at least three times over the last 20 years, and there has never been a comfort level from the community that receives these services on this issue. I do not see any long-term advantage to this. It is working now and people who are receiving the services are comfortable. There does not appear to be any benefit from the consolidation. We need to be able to evaluate the budget accounts separately.

Assemblyman Kirner:

The Agency states that this is merely a consolidation of budgets. What are the consequences, from a fiscal point of view, if we do not approve the consolidation?

Mr. Winebarger:

The Agency will continue to account for the different vocational rehabilitation programs and blind services in two budget accounts the way they are currently set up. This consolidation would move all the accounting functions into B/A 101-3265. The Agency has identified that they could keep track of the different expenditures separately based on general ledgers, categories and job numbers.

Assemblyman Kirner:

Are the resources dedicated to these accounts still going to be there even if we do not consolidate the accounts? I do not see an issue with this as long as the services are there and there is no shifting of personnel.

Chair Smith:

They have an active constituency. I do not have a strong opinion, but this is one of those times that I feel we should probably listen to the constituency.

Assemblyman Sprinkle:

We have talked about wanting to keep these budgets separate so that we are able to monitor them and see where the money is being spent.

Assemblywoman Carlton:

When a group of individuals comes to speak to us, we need to listen and evaluate their concerns. I think we need to retain the transparency and keep it separate. If there is an issue in the future, we can address it at that time.

ASSEMBLYMAN KIRNER MOVED TO RECOMMEND TO THE FULL COMMITTEES TO NOT APPROVE THE FISCAL CONSOLIDATION OF B/A 101-3254 INTO B/A 101-3265.

SENATOR PARKS SECONDED THE MOTION.

ASSEMBLY: THE MOTION CARRIED. (ASSEMBLYMAN BOBZIEN WAS ABSENT FOR THE VOTE.)

SENATE: THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

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Mr. Winebarger:

Decision unit E-228 in B/A 101-3254 relates to federal regulations that require states to implement a comprehensive program of personal development in keeping with national best practices. As a standard of employment, DETR requires rehabilitation counselors to be certified by the Commission on Rehabilitation. The recommendation is \$1,180 over the 2013-2015 biennium for four employees to take the rehabilitation counselor examination. Similar recommendations are made in B/A 101-3265 and B/A 101-3268, for a total cost of \$3,630. Fiscal Division Staff has notified DETR that it has not been the money committees' past practice to fund professional licensure and certification.

Assemblyman Sprinkle:

If we were to start paying for licensures for one group of individuals, we would create a trend. I will make a motion that we do not approve this enhancement.

Assemblyman Kirner:

Should we be asking the current employees who are already in the jobs that require this licensure and certification to absorb the expense?

Mr. Winebarger:

This recertification is required every 5 years. There is an issue for current employees who are currently certified to be recertified.

Assemblyman Kirner:

Is this a new standard for employment wherein the new employees should be absorbing the cost themselves? For existing employees, if they were at risk of losing their jobs because they do not meet the new standard, that would be problematic for me.

Cindy Jones (Assembly Fiscal Analyst):

The work performance standards indicate that certain rehabilitation counselor positions need to provide documentation that they are eligible to sit for the certification exam. I do not see anything in the requirements that indicates that they are required to pass or retain that certification. The work performance standards only require the knowledge, skills and abilities to sit for the exam.

Assemblywoman Carlton:

I would be apprehensive about the State picking up licensure fees for certain employees. If it is your licensure and your certification that you take with you if you leave employment with the State, it is your responsibility.

Assemblyman Kirner:

I agree with Assemblywoman Carlton. My concern was that current employees would be told that they would lose their job if they did not recertify.

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Mr. Winebarger:

Decision unit E-710 in B/A 101-3254 is for replacement equipment in the amount of \$13,317 over the 2013-2015 biennium to purchase six desktop computers, one laptop computer and six printers.

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Mr. Winebarger:

Under B/A 101-3265, the Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation provides rehabilitation services to eligible individuals with disabilities to assist them in preparing for and obtaining meaningful employment and self-sufficiency. The first major closing item in B/A 101-3265 is decision units E-900, E-902, E-903, E-904 and E-905. Based on your decision not to approve the merger of these two budget accounts, Fiscal Staff suggests that you not approve these decision units as well.

SENATOR PARKS SECONDED THE MOTION.

ASSEMBLY: THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

SENATE: THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

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Mr. Winebarger:

In decision unit E-226 of B/A 101-3265, the Governor recommends the reduction of case services expenditures by \$60,000 each year of the 2013-2015 biennium to fund the continuation of a media campaign developed by the Division. The Agency explained the campaign is aimed at individuals who may qualify for rehabilitation services, but were unaware that such services were available. The goal of the campaign is to also educate businesses about the benefits of hiring individuals with disabilities, including informing them of the accommodations the Division can provide employers for their disabled employees.

One of the goals of the Rehabilitation Division is to help individuals become self-sufficient and earn a living wage. By building a bridge to companies who can help individuals meet their employment goals, the Agency asserts the advertising campaign is a good investment, even though case services expenditures are being reduced.

Assemblywoman Carlton:

I will make the motion to approve this, but I would also like to ask the Agency to keep me informed on issues that might arise from this movement of money from services to advertising. We are advertising that we have services, but we are taking money out of services to do the advertising.

ASSEMBLYWOMAN CARLTON MOVED TO RECOMMEND TO THE FULL COMMITTEES TO APPROVE DECISION UNIT E-226 IN B/A 101-3265.

SENATOR KIECKHEFER SECONDED THE MOTION.

ASSEMBLY: THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

SENATE: THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

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Mr. Winebarger:

The Governor recommends transferring the Office of Disability Employment Policy (ODEP) chief position and associated operating costs from the Rehabilitation Administration B/A 101-3268 to the Vocational Rehabilitation B/A 101-3265 in decision units E-510, E-511, E-512, E-513, E-910, E-911, E-912 and E-913. According to DETR, this position was initially charged with managing the Preferred Purchase State Use Program. However, in 2011 it was determined that the need for full-time supervision of that Program was unnecessary and the duties were distributed among other staff. This position was then reassigned to perform business development functions. The chief works directly with employers and industry leaders building individual case models describing how and where disabled individuals can fit into the workforce and works with specific businesses to take advantage of tax credits and benefits. The Agency has indicated that since these duties are directly related to the employment of individuals with disabilities, personnel and related costs should be included as a direct cost to the Vocational Rehabilitation B/A 101-3265.

In addition to transferring the position, the Governor recommends \$18,717 over the 2013-2015 biennium to fund a salary increase for the unclassified ODEP

chief position. The recommended salary increase for the position will be considered by the money committees, so no action is required by the Subcommittee on this issue.

SENATOR PARKS SECONDED THE MOTION.

ASSEMBLY: THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

SENATE: THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

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Mr. Winebarger:

In decision unit E-229 of B/A 101-3265, the Governor recommends that the Carson City office of Vocational Rehabilitation, the Blind Business Enterprises of Nevada (BEN) and Rehabilitation Administration relocate from its leased facility in fiscal year (FY) 2014-2015 due to maintenance issues. Across all three budget accounts, the majority of the costs associated with this move are related to a new phone system and telephone/data wiring costs. The Agency has confirmed that any new phone system will be compatible with the new Enterprise Information Technology Services (EITS) phone system which will be considered in the 2015-2017 biennium. The Agency indicated that these costs were estimates based on previous installations; no third-party quotes were provided. The Agency also stated that some costs would only be needed if the new location has no telecommunication infrastructure in place.

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Mr. Winebarger:

I will now discuss the Blind Business Enterprise of Nevada B/A 101-3253. In decision unit E-225, the Governor recommends using reserve funds of \$239,068 for FY 2013-2014 and \$115,703 for FY 2014-2015 to open four new vendor operator sites in Clark County.

However, as discussed at the Agency's budget hearing on March 22, it appears none of these sites will be developed as BEN programs. Additionally, no new potential sites have yet been identified. Although the Agency has indicated this decision unit could be eliminated under the circumstances, they have requested that the Subcommittee approve it so that if a site becomes available, the opportunity would not be lost due to lack of current authority. However, through the expedited work program process, a work program could be processed within 15 days should the need arise. Fiscal Staff recommends this decision unit not be approved.

Chair Smith:

It does not seem that we had a lot of discussion about this in the budget hearing. If something were to change, the Agency could come back to the Interim Finance Committee (IFC).

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In decision unit E-226 of B/A 101-3253, the Governor recommends reserve funds of \$111,600 in FY 2013-2014 and \$239,700 in FY 2014-2015 for the purchase of new and replacement equipment. The Agency indicated the list of recommended equipment included in the Executive Budget was not intended to represent specific equipment needs, rather it is a list of potential purchases and amounts based on prior experience used to add expenditure authority to the budget account. Based on BEN's average cost of equipment maintenance and equipment purchases over the prior 3 years of \$114,114, plus \$23,945 included in the Base Budget, it appears the amount recommended for FY 2013-2014 is reasonable. Therefore, Fiscal Staff recommends that the FY 2014-2015 equipment purchases be reduced to match the FY 2013-2014 amount of \$111,600.

In decision unit E-229 of B/A 101-3253, the Governor recommends the Carson City office of the Blind Business Enterprise program, Vocational Rehabilitation and Rehabilitation Administration, relocate from its leased facility in FY 2014-2015 due to maintenance issues. The Agency has confirmed that any new phone system will be compatible with the new EITS phone system, which will be considered in the 2015-2017 biennium. The Agency indicated that these costs were estimates based on previous installations; no third-party quotes were provided.

Other closing items in this budget account include decision unit E-227 for in-state travel, replacement and new equipment in decision unit E-710 and E-720, cost allocation in decision unit M-800 and E-800 and finally decision unit E-805 for a position reclassification. The Governor recommends reserves of \$10,659 over the biennium for reclassification of an administrative assistant III position to a program officer I position. The Agency states that the incumbent's duties have changed from clerical to program management and compliance. Subject to the review by the Division of Human Resource Management, Fiscal Staff finds this recommendation reasonable.

Τo pay trust fund interest payments of \$31.2 million for the 2013-2015 biennium, the Governor recommends the Employment Security Division (ESD) administrator impose a special interest assessment on employers. The Governor has submitted A.B. 482 that will allow the ESD administrator to impose this special interest assessment on employers until the loan is repaid. Assembly Bill 482 was heard by the Assembly Committee on Ways and Means on May 6. The Agency proposed an amendment to the bill that removed language indicating that the special interest assessment could be used for debt service payments, if the state issued special obligation bonds to pay off the outstanding UI Trust Fund loan. The authority to issue bonds is being addressed separately. The Committee passed the bill as amended.

ASSEMBLY BILL 482: Imposes a temporary assessment on certain employers for interest payments due on advances made by the Federal Government relating to unemployment benefits. (BDR 53-1166)

The next interest payment of \$17 million is due September 30. The special interest assessment, if approved, would be imposed on an annual basis so that collections would be realized prior to September 30. Decision unit E-245 is contingent upon approval of A.B. 482.

Does the Subcommittee wish to approve the Governor's recommendation in decision unit E-245 to establish revenue and expenditures authority of \$17 million in FY 2013-2014 and \$14.2 million in FY 2014-2015 contingent upon the approval of A.B. 482?

In decision unit E-229, the Governor recommends federal funds of \$173,997 in FY 2013-2014 and \$230,828 in FY 2014-2015 for four new positions in the division's UI Integrity unit: one business process analyst I, one unemployment insurance representative IV and two unemployment insurance representative IIs. The Agency indicates the business process analyst I will serve as the functional lead and work as a liaison for the UI Modernization Project, the unemployment representative IV will act as a fraud investigator, and the unemployment insurance representative II positions will be dedicated to debt collection activities.

In decision unit E-230, the Governor recommends federal funds of \$170,887 in FY 2013-2014 and \$217,770 in FY 2014-2015 for one business process

analyst II and two business process analyst I positions in the Unemployment Insurance Support Service (UISS) Unit. The Agency states the three recommended business process analyst positions are required as a result of the reorganization, technological modernization and increased reporting requirements to the federal government.

In decision unit E-231, the Governor recommends federal funds of \$57,594 in FY 2013-2014 and \$73,398 in FY 2014-2015 for a new ESD manager II position in the unit that will serve in the Northern Telephonic Intake Center. The recommended ESD manager II position will be responsible for the oversight of the day-to-day activities of four statewide UI representative V positions, five UI representative III positions, 26 statewide UI representative II positions, and 15 administrative aide positions.

In decision unit E-233, the Governor recommends \$117,355 in FY 2013-2014 and \$146,535 in FY 2014-2015, a distinction of one-half federal funds and one-half Career Enhancement Program (CEP) wage assessment revenues, for two new ESD Program Specialist positions to serve in the Workforce Investment Support Services (WISS) Unit as Workforce Investment Act program monitors. The Agency states that the WISS has the responsibility for providing oversight of numerous workforce investment programs and initiatives.

Fiscal Staff notes that although the agency has indicated that these positions will replace the need for an outside accounting firm to perform these monitoring functions, it failed to remove these contract accounting costs from the Base Budget. If the Subcommittee approves this decision unit, Fiscal Staff suggests it reduce the Base Budget by \$39,371 each year of the biennium.

If the Subcommittee approves decision unit E-233, does it also wish to modify the Base Budget and remove \$39,371 each year of the biennium since monitoring services provided by an outside accounting firm will no longer be necessary?

Assemblyman Hickey:

I am in favor of the increased support for investigations into unemployment fraud.

Assemblyman Hambrick:

Will technical adjustments be needed to these decision units?

Mr. Winebarger:

The only adjustment would be that the positions are based on the recommendation of the additional positions by the Division of Human Resource Management.

Since the WSU will provide support and information across the department, including grants management for the Department and employment strategies for the Vocational Rehabilitation program, the Governor also recommends changing the funding for the WSU from federal funds to the department-wide cost-allocation plan which, according to the Agency, is reviewed and approved annually by the U.S. Department of Labor.
