<u>BILL DRAFT REQUEST 43-167</u>: Revises provisions relating to motor vehicles. (Later introduced as Senate Bill 431.)

#### **Jered McDonald (Policy Analyst):**

There were a number of proposed amendments to <u>Senate Bill (S.B.) 204</u> as shown in your work session document (<u>Exhibit C</u>).

**SENATE BILL 204**: Requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to establish a next-of-kin registry. (BDR 43-712)

There were three amendments proposed by Senator Gustavson. The first expands the use of the Next-of-Kin Registry beyond automobile crashes. This amendment states that the registry can be used for an injury or death as a result of a criminal act or other emergency situation. The second one expands the contact information in the registry to include the address of an emergency contact.

The third amendment proposed by Senator Gustavson adds persons holding a commercial driver's license to the registry.

An amendment proposed by the Clark County Coroner, Michael Murphy gives access to the Next-of-Kin registry by the County Coroner/Medical Examiner's Office personnel and employees.

The last amendment, proposed during the committee meeting of March 13, 2013, changes the effective date from January 1, 2014 to July 1, 2015.

#### **Senator Gustavson:**

I agree with all the amendments. They are friendly amendments and good ones. Committee, please accept the amendments and approve <u>S.B. 204</u>.

SENATOR ATKINSON MOVED TO AMEND AND DO PASS AS AMENDED S.B. 204.

**SENATE BILL 19:** Revises provisions concerning driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a controlled substance. (BDR 43-366)

#### Chair Manendo:

Ms. Johnson, can you update the Committee on <u>S.B. 19</u>? I remember there being confusion among Committee members when we first heard <u>S.B. 19</u> on February 27. We decided to not proceed with it until you conferred with Tom Conner, Department of Motor Vehicles, and Laurel Stadler, Northern Nevada DUI Task Force.

#### Darcy Johnson (Counsel):

Mr. Conner and Ms. Stadler prefer the wording of the proposed amendment to S.B. 19, and the Legal Division agrees. We think it expresses the bill's intent.

SENATOR HARDY MOVED TO AMEND AND DO PASS AS AMENDED S.B. 19.

SENATOR SPEARMAN SECONDED THE MOTION.
