SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the practice of veterinary medicine. (BDR 54-247)

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets formitted materiall is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to veterinary medicine; authorizing a veterinarian or veterinary technician who is licensed in another state to provide professional services in this State during a critical incident under certain circumstances; authorizing a qualified organization to establish a temporary veterinary facility to provide shelter, food, water and veterinary care to certain animals; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires any person who practices veterinary medicine in this State to hold a license issued by the Nevada State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners. (NRS 638.090) Existing law exempts from that requirement certain veterinary specialists who are called into this State by a licensed veterinarian for consultation and certain veterinarians licensed in adjoining states whose practice reasonably extends into portions of this State. (NRS 638.015, 638.125) Existing law also exempts out-of-state health practitioners, including veterinarians, from certain licensing requirements if those health practitioners are registered during a declared emergency. (NRS 415A.210, 415A.220) **Section 1** of this bill authorizes a law enforcement agency, animal control agency or society for the prevention of cruelty to animals to request the assistance of, or to allow, a veterinarian or veterinary technician who is licensed in another state to provide veterinary services during a critical incident. A "critical incident" is defined to mean a situation involving numerous sick or injured animals at a single location where veterinary care is needed or during which licensed veterinarians are overburdened. Furthermore, section 1 allows those agencies to authorize a qualified organization to establish a



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17 temporary facility to provide shelter and care to animals during a critical incident. 18

Finally, this bill requires that the Board be notified whenever such temporary

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 638 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. Upon request by or with the authorization of a law enforcement agency, animal control agency or society for the prevention of cruelty to animals which has jurisdiction over a critical incident:
- (a) A veterinarian who is licensed to practice veterinary medicine in another state may provide veterinary medical, surgical, obstetrical or dental services, reasonable in scope and duration, during the critical incident.
- (b) A veterinary technician who is licensed as a veterinary technician in another state may provide assistance or technical or professional services related to veterinary medicine, reasonable in scope and duration, during the critical incident.
- (c) A qualified organization may, without obtaining a license from the Board, establish a temporary veterinary facility, reasonable in scope and duration, to receive animals affected by the critical incident to provide shelter, food and water, and a location for veterinary care for those animals.
- 2. An agency that requests or allows a veterinarian or veterinary technician to provide services during a critical incident pursuant to subsection 1 must:
- (a) Determine that the veterinarian or veterinary technician is licensed as a veterinarian or veterinary technician in another state:
- (b) Obtain the name, address, telephone number and state of licensure of the veterinarian or veterinary technician; and
- (c) As soon as practicable, forward the information obtained pursuant to paragraph (b) and a brief statement describing the critical incident to the Board.
- 3. An agency that requests or allows a qualified organization to establish a temporary veterinary facility pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection 1 must:
- (a) Obtain the name, address and telephone number of the qualified organization and the name and telephone number of the person in charge of the temporary veterinary facility; and
- (b) As soon as practicable, notify the Board and provide the Board with the information obtained pursuant to paragraph (a)



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and a description and location of the temporary veterinary facility and the critical incident.

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- 4. As used in this section:(a) "Critical incident" means a situation in which numerous animals in a single location are found to be sick or injured and require veterinary care because of abuse, cruelty, neglect, criminal activity, animal hoarding, accident, disaster, outbreak of disease or other occurrence for which licensed veterinarians are overburdened or are otherwise not reasonably available.
- (b) "Qualified organization" means a nonprofit organization organized under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3), for the purpose of preventing cruelty to animals.

Sec. 2. NRS 638.090 is hereby amended to read as follows:

638.090 [It] Except as otherwise provided in NRS 415A.220 and 638.125 and section 1 of this act, it is unlawful for any person to practice veterinary medicine, surgery, obstetrics or dentistry within the State of Nevada without a license issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter.

- **Sec. 3.** NRS 638.132 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 638.132 [The] 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the Board shall adopt regulations which prescribe the requirements for the licensure of a facility in which veterinary medicine is practiced, including, without limitation, the fee for the issuance and renewal of a license.
- A temporary veterinary facility established pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection 1 of section 1 of this act in response to a critical incident is not subject to any regulation adopted pursuant to this section, but remains subject to inspection and closure by the Board.
 - **Sec. 4.** NRS 638.170 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 638.170 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 2 and 33 3 [of this section] and NRS 638.1525, a person who violates any of the provisions of this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor. 34
 - 2. A Except as otherwise provided in NRS 415A.220 and 638.125 and section 1 of this act, a person who practices veterinary medicine without a license issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter is guilty of a category D felony and shall be punished as provided in NRS 193.130.
 - 3. A Except as otherwise provided in NRS 415A.220 and 638.125 and section 1 of this act, a person who practices as a veterinary technician without a license issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter is guilty of a gross misdemeanor and shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than





364 days, or by a fine of not more than \$2,000, or by both fine and imprisonment.
