SUMMARY—Creates the Office of Military Legal Assistance within the Office of the Attorney General. (BDR 18-607)

AN ACT relating to the Office of the Attorney General; creating the Office of Military Legal Assistance within the Office of the Attorney General to provide certain services to current and former military personnel in this State; providing that an attorney who renders pro bono services for the Office of Military Legal Assistance is not liable for civil damages in certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Section 2 of this bill creates the Office of Military Legal Assistance within the Office of the Attorney General. Section 3 of this bill authorizes: (1) the Office of Military Legal Assistance to facilitate the delivery of legal assistance programs, pro bono services and self-help services to current and former military personnel in this State; and (2) the Attorney General to apply for and accept grants, gifts, donations, bequests or devises on behalf of the Office of Military Legal Assistance to carry out the functions of the Office of Military Legal Assistance.

Section 4 of this bill provides that an attorney who is licensed to practice law in this State and who renders pro bono services for the Office of Military Legal Assistance is not liable for any civil damages as a result of any act or omission by the attorney in rendering such services if the services were rendered in good faith and in a manner not amounting to gross negligence.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Chapter 228 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.

Sec. 2. The Office of Military Legal Assistance is hereby created within the Office of the Attorney General.

Sec. 3. 1. The Office of Military Legal Assistance may facilitate the delivery of legal assistance programs, pro bono services and self-help services to current and former military personnel in this State.

2. The Attorney General may apply for and accept grants, gifts, donations, bequests or devises on behalf of the Office of Military Legal Assistance which must be used to carry out the

12 functions of the Office of Military Legal Assistance.

Sec. 4. Any attorney who is licensed to practice law in this State and who renders pro bono services for the Office of Military Legal Assistance is not liable for any civil damages as a result of any act or omission by the attorney in rendering such services if the services were rendered in good faith and in a manner not amounting to gross negligence.

**Sec. 5.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2015.
