AN ACT relating to education; requiring principals to coordinate with teachers to develop class lesson plans that comply with certain academic standards; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Council to Establish Academic Standards for Public Schools to establish standards of content and performance for certain courses of study. Existing law also requires the State Board of Education to review and adopt the standards established by the Council. (NRS 389.520) This bill requires principals to coordinate with teachers to develop class lesson plans that comply with the academic standards established by the Council and adopted by the State Board.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 389 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. The principal of each elementary school must coordinate with a teacher from each grade level within the school; and
- 2. The principal of each middle school, junior high school and high school must coordinate with the teachers whom the principal has designated as the heads of each subject area taught at the school,

Sec. 2. NRS 389.500 is hereby amended to read as follows: 389.500 As used in NRS 389.500 to 389.570, inclusive, and section 1 of this act, "Council" means the Council to Establish Academic Standards for Public Schools.
Sec. 3. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2015. 4
