AN ACT relating to education; requiring principals to coordinate with teachers to develop class lesson plans that comply with certain academic standards; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires the Council to Establish Academic Standards for Public
2 Schools to establish standards of content and performance for certain courses of
3 study. Existing law also requires the State Board of Education to review and adopt
4 the standards established by the Council. (NRS 389.520) This bill requires
5 principals to coordinate with teachers to develop class lesson plans that comply
6 with the academic standards established by the Council and adopted by the State
7 Board.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 389 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 3 *1. The principal of each elementary school must coordinate*
4 *with a teacher from each grade level within the school; and*
5 *2. The principal of each middle school, junior high school*
6 *and high school must coordinate with the teachers whom the*
7 *principal has designated as the heads of each subject area taught*
8 *at the school,*



1 ➔ *to develop class lesson plans that comply with the standards of*
2 *content and performance established by the Council.*

3 **Sec. 2.** NRS 389.500 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 389.500 As used in NRS 389.500 to 389.570, inclusive, *and*
5 *section 1 of this act*, “Council” means the Council to Establish
6 Academic Standards for Public Schools.

7 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2015.
