## ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 431–COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES, AGRICULTURE, AND MINING

## MARCH 23, 2015

SUMMARY—Requires the State Department of Agriculture to develop and carry out a management plan for certain horses. (BDR 50-1131)

AN ACT relating to horses; requiring the State Department of Agriculture to develop and carry out a management plan for certain horses; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:** 

Existing federal law places the management of certain wild horses and burros under certain federal agencies and protects such animals from harassment and killing. (16 U.S.C. §§ 1331 et seq.) This bill requires the State Department of Agriculture to develop and implement a program for the humane and ecologically sound management of those feral, estray or wild horses that do not fall under the responsibility and protection of the Federal Government.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Chapter 569 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. The Department shall develop and carry out a management plan to achieve and maintain appropriate management levels of horses subject to the management of the Department.
- 7 2. The management plan developed pursuant to subsection 1 must:

- (a) Identify appropriate management levels of horses subject to the management of the Department; and
- (b) Use humane methods of reproductive control for both male and female horses subject to the management of the Department.
  - 3. The Department shall:

- (a) Implement the management plan developed pursuant to subsection 1; and
  - (b) Update and revise the plan, as necessary.
  - 4. As used in this section:
- (a) "Appropriate management level" means the optimum number of horses subject to the management of the Department which supports an ecological balance between species conservation, herd health, habitat sustainability and forage vitality.
- (b) "Horses subject to the management of the Department" means any horse which is not privately owned, controlled and maintained or which is not subject to the jurisdiction of the Federal Government pursuant to the Wild Free-Roaming Horses and Burros Act, 16 U.S.C. §§ 1331 to 1340, inclusive, and includes, without limitation, horses which are feral livestock, estray or wild.
  - **Sec. 2.** NRS 569.005 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 569.005 As used in NRS 569.005 to 569.130, inclusive, *and* section 1 of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 569.006 to 569.0085, inclusive, have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.
