

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 99—ASSEMBLYMAN ELLISON

SUMMARY—Makes various changes concerning construction and labor camps. (BDR 40-53)

AN ACT relating to sanitation; exempting an organizational camp that is owned or operated by a nonprofit organization from the sanitation requirements applicable to construction and labor camps in certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law imposes certain sanitation requirements relating to the
2 construction and operation of a construction or labor camp where five or more
3 persons are employed. (NRS 444.130-444.200) This bill exempts from those
4 provisions an organizational camp that is owned or operated by a nonprofit
5 organization that qualifies as a tax-exempt organization if the camp takes place on
6 property for which a special use permit has been issued by the United States
7 Department of Agriculture subject to an agreement with the Department.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 444 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 *An organizational camp that is owned or operated by a*
4 *nonprofit organization that qualifies as a tax-exempt organization*
5 *pursuant to 26 U.S.C. § 501(c) and which takes place on property*
6 *for which a special use permit has been issued by the United States*
7 *Department of Agriculture subject to an agreement with the*
8 *Department is not subject to the provisions of NRS 444.130 to*
9 *444.200, inclusive, so long as the agreement remains in force.*
