SUMMARY—Establishes certain requirements for the operation of seasonal or temporary recreation programs. (BDR 38-506)

AN ACT relating to care of children; establishing certain requirements for the operation of a seasonal or temporary recreation program; **clarifying that the operator of such a program is not required to obtain a license or permit**; providing a civil penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 Existing law requires a local government that operates an out-of-school recreation
2 program to comply with certain health and safety standards and to comply with other
3 requirements relating to the safety of participants in the program. (NRS 432A.610) ~~Certain~~
4 ~~requirements for the staff of an out of school recreation program are set forth in existing law.~~
5 ~~(NRS 432A.620)~~ Existing law further requires an out-of-school recreation program to
6 maintain certain records regarding participants in the program. (NRS 432A.630) **Sections 11**
7 **+** **and 13** of this bill make such requirements imposed on an out-of-school recreation
8 program applicable to a nongovernmental person or entity that operates a seasonal or
9 temporary recreation program. **Section 11 also clarifies that such a person or entity is not**
10 **required to obtain a license or permit**
11 **Existing law requires a local government that operates an out-of-school recreation**
12 **program to complete, for each member of the staff of the program, a background and**
13 **personal history check and a child abuse and neglect screening. (NRS 432A.620) Section**
14 **12 of this bill makes this requirement applicable to nongovernmental persons and**
15 **entities that operate certain seasonal or temporary recreation programs. Section 14 of**
16 **this bill imposes a civil penalty not to exceed \$500 on a person who operates a seasonal or**
17 **temporary recreation program for failure to comply with such requirements.**

9 *program is not required to obtain a license or permit pursuant to this chapter but*
10 *shall ensure that each site upon which the program is conducted:*

11 1. *Complies with applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations*
12 *concerning safety standards;*

13 2. *Complies with applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations*
14 *concerning health standards;*

15 3. *Has a complete first-aid kit accessible on-site that complies with the*
16 *requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration of the United*
17 *States Department of Labor;*

18 4. *Has an emergency exit plan posted on-site in a conspicuous place; and*

19 5. *Has at least one staff member on-site and available during the hours of*
20 *operation who is certified and receives annual training in the use and*
21 *administration of first aid, including, without limitation, cardiopulmonary*
22 *resuscitation.*

23 Sec. 12. *1. A person who operates a seasonal or temporary recreation*
24 *program described in subsection 2 shall complete, for each member of the staff of*
25 *the program:*

26 ~~12-~~ (a) *A background and personal history check; and*

27 ~~12-~~ (b) *A child abuse and neglect screening through the Statewide Central*
28 *Registry for the Collection of Information Concerning the Abuse or Neglect of a*
29 *Child established by NRS 432.100 to determine whether there has been a*
30 *substantiated report of child abuse or neglect made against the staff member.*

31 2. *A person who operates a seasonal or temporary recreation program is*
32 *subject to the provisions of subsection 1 if the seasonal or temporary recreation*
33 *program is:*

34 *(a) A special sports event, including, without limitation, a camp, clinic,*
35 *demonstration or workshop which focuses on a particular sport;*

36 *(b) A therapeutic program for children with disabilities, including, without*
37 *limitation, social activities, outings and other inclusion activities;*

38 *(c) An athletic training program, including, without limitation, a baseball or*
39 *other sports league and exercise instruction; or*

40 *(d) Another special interest program, including, without limitation, an arts*
41 *and crafts workshop, theater camp and dance competition.*

42 Sec. 13. 1. *The person who operates a seasonal or temporary recreation*
43 *program shall maintain records containing pertinent information regarding each*
44 *participant in the program. Such information must include, without limitation:*

45 (a) *The full legal name of the child and the preferred name of the child;*

46 (b) *The date of birth of the child;*

47 (c) *The current address where the child resides;*

48 (d) *The name, address and telephone number of each parent or legal*
49 *guardian of the child and any special instructions for contacting the parent or*
50 *legal guardian during the hours when the child participates in the program;*

51 (e) *Information concerning the health of the child, including, without*
52 *limitation, any special needs of the child; and*

53 (f) *Any other information requested by the Division.*

1 2. *The distribution of any information maintained pursuant to this section*
2 *is subject to the limitations set forth in NRS 239.0105.*

3 **Sec. 14.** *A person who operates a seasonal or temporary recreation*
4 *program and who fails to comply with any provision of section 11, 12 or 13 of this*
5 *act is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$500 for each failure to comply. The*
6 *Attorney General or any district attorney of this State may recover the penalty in*
7 *a civil action brought in the name of the State of Nevada in any court of*
8 *competent jurisdiction.*
