SUMMARY—~~Provides for~~ Requires the use of portable event recording devices by certain peace officers ~~employed by the Nevada Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety.~~ (BDR ~~43-618~~ 43-618)

AN ACT relating to ~~peace officers;~~ the Nevada Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety; requiring certain peace officers employed by the Nevada Highway Patrol to wear a portable event recording device under certain circumstances; requiring ~~certain law enforcement agencies;~~ the Nevada Highway Patrol to adopt policies and procedures governing the use of portable event recording devices; providing that records made by portable event recording devices are public records and may be requested under certain circumstances; exempting the use of portable event recording devices from provisions governing the interception of certain communications; exempting the use of portable event recording devices upon certain property; requiring the Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice to review ~~any~~ the policies and procedures adopted by ~~a law enforcement agency;~~ the Nevada Highway Patrol governing the use of portable event recording devices; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Section 1 of this bill requires: (1) certain peace officers employed by the Nevada Highway Patrol to wear a portable event recording device while on duty; and (2) ~~certain law enforcement agencies;~~ the Nevada Highway Patrol to adopt policies and procedures governing the use of portable event recording devices. Section 1 also establishes that any record made by a portable event recording device is a public record which may only be requested: (1) on a per incident basis; and (2) viewed at the location where the record is held if the record contains confidential information.

Existing law authorizes investigative or law enforcement officers to intercept wire or oral communications, subject to certain requirements. (NRS 179.410-179.515) Section 2 of this bill exempts a portable event recording device worn by a peace officer employed by the Nevada Highway Patrol from the definition of an “electronic, mechanical or other device” used to intercept wire or oral communication.

13 Existing law also prohibits surreptitious electronic surveillance on: (1) the grounds of any  
14 facility owned or leased by the State of Nevada; (2) the property of a public school; or (3) a  
15 campus of the Nevada System of Higher Education. (NRS 331.200, 393.400, 396.970)  
16 **Sections 3-5** of this bill create an exception for peace officers employed by the Nevada  
17 Highway Patrol wearing a portable event recording device in accordance with **section 1** from  
18 certain provisions relating to unlawful surreptitious electronic surveillance.

19 **Section 6.5** of this bill requires ~~each law enforcement agency~~ the Nevada Highway  
20 Patrol to adopt initial policies and procedures governing the use of portable event recording  
21 devices by July 1, 2016. **Section 6.5** further requires the Advisory Commission on the  
22 Administration of Justice to review such initial policies and procedures at a meeting on or  
23 after July 1, 2016.

24 **Section 6.3 of this bill makes an appropriation for the 2015-2017 biennium from the**  
25 **State Highway Fund to the Nevada Highway Patrol for the purpose of carrying out the**  
**requirements of this bill.**

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter ~~1280~~ **480** of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a  
2 new section to read as follows:

3 **1. ~~Each law enforcement agency or chief of school police~~ The Nevada**  
**Highway Patrol shall:**

5 **(a) Require each uniformed peace officer ~~fit employ~~ employed by the**  
**Nevada Highway Patrol who routinely interacts with the public to wear a portable**  
**event recording device while on duty.**

6 **(b) Adopt policies and procedures governing the use of portable event**  
**recording devices, including, without limitation:**

7 **(I) Requiring activation of a portable event recording device whenever a**  
**peace officer is:**

8 **(I) Responding to a call for service; or**

9 **(II) Initiating a law enforcement or investigative encounter with a**  
**member of the public;**

10 **(2) Prohibiting deactivation of a portable event recording device until the**  
**conclusion of the event described in subparagraph (1);**

11 **(3) Protecting the privacy of persons:**

12 **(I) In private residences;**

13 **(II) Seeking to report a crime or provide information regarding a**  
**crime or ongoing investigation anonymously; and**

14 **(III) Claiming to be a victim of a crime;**

15 **(4) Requiring that any record made by a portable event recording device**  
**be retained by the ~~law enforcement agency~~ Nevada Highway Patrol for not less**  
**than 15 days; and**

16 **(5) Establishing disciplinary rules for peace officers who:**

17 **(I) Fail to operate a portable event recording device in accordance**  
**with any policy or procedure adopted pursuant to this section;**

18 **(II) Intentionally manipulate any record made by a portable event**  
**recording device in violation of any policy or procedure adopted pursuant to this**  
**section; or**

19 **(III) Prematurely erase or destroy any record made by a portable**  
**event recording device.**

20 **2. Any record made by a portable event recording device pursuant to this**  
**section is a public record which may only be:**

21 **(a) Requested on a per incident basis; and**

1                   **(b) Available for inspection at the location where the record is held if the**  
2                   **record contains confidential information that may not otherwise be redacted.**

3                   **3. As used in this section:**

4                   **(a) "Law enforcement agency" means:**

5                   **(1) The sheriff's office of a county;**

6                   **(2) A metropolitan police department;**

7                   **(3) A police department of an incorporated city;**

8                   **(4) The Department of Public Safety; or**

9                   **(5) The Police Department of the Nevada System of Higher Education.**

10                  **(b) "Portable," "portable event recording device" means a device issued to a**  
11                  **peace officer employed by [a law enforcement agency or chief of school police]**  
12                  **the Nevada Highway Patrol to be worn on his or her body and which records**  
13                  **both audio and visual events during an encounter with a member of the public**  
14                  **while performing his or her duties as a peace officer.**

15                  Sec. 2. NRS 179.425 is hereby amended to read as follows:

16                  179.425 "Electronic, mechanical or other device" means any device or  
17 apparatus which can be used to intercept a wire or oral communication other than:

18                  1. Any telephone instrument, equipment or facility, or any component  
19 thereof:

21 the ordinary course of its business and being used by the subscriber or user in the  
22 ordinary course of its business; or

23                  (b) Being used by a communications common carrier in the ordinary course of

25 of his or her duties.

26                  2. A hearing aid or similar device being used to correct subnormal hearing to  
27 not better than normal.

39      book or record which is copyrighted pursuant to federal law.

40      2. A governmental entity may not reject a book or record which is  
41      copyrighted solely because it is copyrighted.

42      3. A governmental entity that has legal custody or control of a public book or  
43      record shall not deny a request made pursuant to subsection 1 to inspect or copy or  
44      receive a copy of a public book or record on the basis that the requested public  
45      book or record contains information that is confidential if the governmental entity  
46      can redact, delete, conceal or separate the confidential information from the  
47      information included in the public book or record that is not otherwise confidential.

48      4. A person may request a copy of a public record in any medium in which  
49      the public record is readily available. An officer, employee or agent of a  
50      governmental entity who has legal custody or control of a public record:

51       (a) Shall not refuse to provide a copy of that public record in a readily  
52      available medium because the officer, employee or agent has already prepared or  
53      would prefer to provide the copy in a different medium.

2 the copy of the public record and shall not require the person who has requested the  
3 copy to prepare the copy himself or herself.

2. The sums appropriated by subsection 1 are available for either fiscal year. Any remaining balance of those sums must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2017, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after September 15, 2017, by either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State Highway Fund on or before September 15, 2017.

Sec. 6.5. 1. [Each law enforcement agency and chief of school police in this State] **The Nevada Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public Safety** shall adopt, at a minimum, initial policies and procedures as required by section 1 of this act, on or before July 1, 2016.

2. The Advisory Commission on the Administration of Justice created pursuant to NRS 176.0123 shall, at a meeting held by the Commission, include as an item on the agenda a discussion of the progress of law enforcement agencies and chiefs of school police in this State **the Nevada Highway Patrol** in adopting initial policies and procedures as required by section 1 of this act. The meeting must be held on or after July 1, 2016.

3. [A representative of each law enforcement agency and chief of school police] **The Director of the Department** shall attend the meeting required by subsection 2 to provide a report concerning the progress of his or her agency **the Nevada Highway Patrol** in adopting such policies and procedures.

4. As used in this section, "law enforcement agency" has the meaning ascribed to it in section 1 of this act.]

**Sec. 7. 1. This section and section 6.5 of this act become effective upon passage and approval.**

2. Sections 1 to 6, inclusive, of this act become effective upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting policies and procedures governing the use of portable event recording devices and on January 1, 2017, for all other purposes.

**3. Section 6.3 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2015.**
