SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION—Proposing to amend the Nevada Constitution to require proof of identity to vote in person.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

This resolution requires a registered voter who wishes to vote in person to present photographic proof of identity to the applicable election board officer. Acceptable forms of proof of identity are: (1) certain government-issued documents or identity cards that show a recognizable photograph of the person to whom the document or card was issued; (2) a voter identification card; or (3) certain documentation from an administrator of certain licensed health care facilities. The resolution requires the Legislature to direct by law one or more governmental entities to issue, at no cost, voter identification cards to registered voters who do not possess other types of proof of identity. This resolution also requires such a voter identification to include the name, address, date of birth, photograph and signature of the person to whom the card is issued.

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, JOINTLY, That a new section, designated Section 11, be added to Article 2 of the Nevada Constitution to read as follows:

Sec. 11. 1. A registered voter who wishes to vote in person must present his or her proof of identity to the applicable election board officer.

7	3. A voter identification card issued to a person

10	date of birth, photograph and signature of the person; and
11	(b) Is valid as long as the person is registered to vote and

15	(1) An elected or appointed officer of this State or of

17	(2) An institution, board, commission, bureau,

21	Government, or of a political subdivision of this State.
22	(b) "Proof of identity" means:
23	(1) A document or identity card that:
24	(I) Is issued by a governmental entity, the United
25	States or a federally recognized Indian tribe;
26	(II) Shows a recognizable photograph of the
27	person to whom the document or identity card is issued;
28	(III) Shows the name and signature of the person
29	to whom the document or identity card is issued; and
30	(IV) Bears an expiration date that is not earlier
31	than 4 years before the date of the election for which the
32	document or identity card is offered as proof of identity;
33	(2) A voter identification card issued pursuant to
34	subsection 2; or
35	(3) A document provided by the administrator of a
36	licensed medical facility or licensed facility for the
37	dependent, as those terms are defined by statute, to a
38	resident of the facility attesting to the person's identity and
39	that he or she is a resident of the facility.
