The State Treasurer's Office has reviewed BDR 34-258 and we cannot determine its fiscal impact at this time. The BDR does not change the fiscal impact of the original legislation as the maximum amount a student may receive remains unchanged at \$10,000. While sections 3, 4 and 5 incrementally increase the maximum number of credits that a student may receive funding for from 12 credits per semester to 15 credits per semester, sections 1 and 2 incrementally increase the amount of credits that a community college student must be enrolled for to be eligible for funding from 6 credits per semester to 12 credits per semester. The Treasurer's Office cannot determine the net fiscal impact of this BDR at this time.
