#### Explanation

BDR 43-17 enhances the penalties for certain traffic violations in pedestrian safety zones. Under the bill, a driver would be subject to the doubling of penalties if convicted in a court of law. The additional penalties would be imprisonment for up to 6-months or a fine up to \$1,000, or both. As well, the driver could be given up to 120 hours of community service.

Section 15(3) of the bill allows for the court to order the driver to attend a course on pedestrian, bicycle and traffic safety approved by the Department. The Department of Motor Vehicles regulates the driver training schools under NRS and NAC Chapter 483 which provide driver instruction courses to the public. It is the Department's interpretation that the course described in Section 15(3) pertains to the programs offered under the Department of Public Safety, Office of Traffic Safety.

There are no new offenses which would require changes to the DMV application. The agency has reviewed the bill and determined that there is no fiscal impact.
