#### Explanation

BDR 15-515 (SB175) relates to public safety. Section 3 of this bill adds to the list of persons prohibited from possessing a firearm persons who have been convicted in this State or any other state of a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence as defined in federal law. Section 5 provides that if an extended order for protection against domestic violence is issued, the adverse party is prohibited from purchasing or otherwise acquiring a firearm during the period that the extended protection order is in effect. A person who violates such a provision is guilty of a category B felony. If enacted, the General Services Division (GSD) would need to modify and create Nevada Offense Codes (NOCs). The NOCs are used by all Nevada criminal justice agencies to share arrest and booking information electronically with GSD's Criminal History Repository and the Administrative Office of the Courts. The additions and revisions of the NOCs can be a time and labor-intensive effort depending upon the complexity of the crimes. The cumulative impact to the division's Criminal History Repository resulting from revisions, additions and deletions to the NOCs must be considered. GSD requests to return to the Nevada Legislature's Interim Finance Committee in the 2016-2017 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing. Additionally, Section 13 of this bill repeals NRS 202.3689 which governs the process performed by the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to provide annually to the Nevada Sheriffs' and Chiefs' Association a list of states that meet Nevada's requirements for permits to carry concealed firearms for possible permit recognition in Nevada. The statute comparison effort is labor intensive and requires GSD staff to gather information from other states and develop a recommendation. If enacted, this bill would result with a positive time savings of DPS, GSD Brady staff resources.
