This bill proposes revisions to crisis and emergency response plans for public and private schools (NRS 392 and NRS 394, respectively).

It does not appear that this legislation would have a direct impact on the Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE). While several NSHE institutions have partnered with local school districts to offer programs to high school aged students, the students remain under the administrative oversight of the local school district.

According to the Board of Regents Handbook, the authority for the development, implementation, compliance monitoring, and administration of Environmental Health and Safety (EH&S) programs, including Emergency Preparedness and Emergency Response, is delegated to the president of each institution. The Handbook recommends that EH&S programs be comprehensive in nature, taking into consideration the health and safety of employees, students, and visitors, including public and private school students who may be participating in campus activities.

If enacted, it appears that this legislation would have no direct fiscal impact on the NSHE or its institutions.
