The Department of Corrections has reviewed BDR 15-653 which deals with filing a forged or fraudulent lien or encumbrance against the real property of a public officer or his or her immediate relatives with the intent to threaten the official will be a category B felony. The first offense will be punishable with a prison sentence of 2 to 10 years. However, if the offender is found to engage in a pattern of consistently committing these types of violations, the punishment will be for 6 to 20 years. The BDR proposes to create new crimes that could potentially increase the number of offenders sentenced to prison. However, the extent of the impact cannot be estimated at this time due to the lack of baseline data.
