Section 9 would allow a customer to choose to not have their information transmitted to the Secretary of State's Office. Sections 10 and 11 require that personal and voter information data be collected and transmitted to the Secretary of State's office, then immediately removed from the Department's records. Section 14 will require the Department to build a preregistration program for 16 and 17 year olds who choose to preregister. The program will allow for a person to update or cancel his/her voter registration data prior to the age of 18. Section 32 requires the Department to report on all original and updated voter registration data. Section 33 requires the Department to insert a voter registration application in every mailer sent to a customer. The FY 14 number of pieces mailed through the State mailroom was 4,073,620.

The proposed implementation date of 01/01/2016 cannot be met as a result of the estimated programming hours needed to complete the requirements. Due to the Department's existing programming priorities and mandates, funding for two computer systems Master Service Agreement programmers is included in this fiscal note. The estimated contract programming hours are 5,272 at \$100 per hour, for a total of \$527,200.
