Comment: If this Bill was to pass without allowing local governments/municipalities from restricting firearms in City Buildings and Court Rooms, there would be a large Fiscal Impact. Some of those impacts would be felt in our Municipal Courts. Municipal Court would need to hire additional Court Marshal's/security to monitor individuals Each additional Marshal hired would cost roughly \$100,000. If there were a complete inability to restrict firearms, a recommendation would be to double up the number of Marshals in each courtroom - at a minimum.

- o That would require 7 additional marshals for a minimum cost of \$700,000.
- o With the many new marshals, you would also need to hire an additional sergeant at an estimate of roughly \$140,000 total cost.
- o The combined minimum cost IF firearms could not be restricted would be roughly \$840,000 annually just for the courthouse.

Based on the estimate of additional Marshals being hired the estimated cost of over the next three fiscal years would be \$2,520,000. In addition there also would be an operational impact and security concerns in that this bill could impact the ability of the court & city to restrict firearms in court and city facilities.

Based on these concerns clarification might be needed that we would be able to restrict possession in certain Municipal buildings for safety purposes.
