## **Explanation**

The Nevada Department of Corrections has reviewed BDR 14-841 which makes changes to chapter 176 of NRS to include revisions to dictate that youthful offenders sentenced to a state prison on a felony conviction will be housed at a state facility for the detention of children. The law will apply to offenders who are less than 18 years old and are not a risk to others or to themselves if housed at a children's facility. If the sentence doesn't end before the youthful offender turns 18, the offender will be transferred to serve the remaining portion of the sentence at an NDOC housing location.

The law is not likely to result in significant cost savings for the NDOC because a very small number of youth offenders will qualify to begin their sentences at a CFS camp for minors. Youthful offenders that are admitted to the NDOC are violent offenders that committed serious offenses or have been arrested a few times for misdemeanor offenses before they were sentenced to prison.
