#### Explanation

BDR 54-701 (AB231) Section 6 requires a chiropractic physician licensee whose license has expired and who is applying to reinstate the license to submit a set of his or her fingerprints and pay a fee for the processing of the fingerprints. If enacted, this bill will increase the Department of Public Safety, General Services Division (GSD), Civil Applicant Fingerprint and Examiner units' workloads. Because GSD has no way to estimate the number of individuals this reinstatement could cover, and thus no way to estimate the additional number of fingerprint submissions that may be required, a definitive cost estimate cannot be provided at this time. The cumulative impact to the division's Criminal History Repository resulting from applicant submission of fingerprint-based background checks must be considered. GSD requests to return to the Nevada Legislature's Interim Finance Committee in the 2016-2017 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing. Also, if this BDR is actually drafted in to a bill, because this bill is adding the fingerprint background check requirement to a statute where the provision did not previously exist, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) will need to approve the language pursuant to Public Law 92-544 as a condition of releasing its criminal history records.
