This bill requires the Secretary of State, each voter registration agency, and each county clerk to cooperatively establish a system providing for certain electronic applications to register to vote and for the electronic transmission of certain information relating to voter registration. Sections 77 - 82 further prescribe certain duties of a voter registration agency.

Existing law designates the offices of certain governmental agencies as voter registration agencies which are required to offer applications to register to vote to persons who apply for or receive services from the agency, to assist applicants in completing the applications and to forward the applications to the county clerk. ADSD is a voter registration agency.

This bill requires voter registration agencies to establish a system by which voter registration information is collected by the voter registration agency from each person who applies for or receives services or aid from the agency, and to transmit the information collected electronically to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State must establish a system by which the information collected may be transmitted electronically. The system must ensure secure electronic storage of information collected; ensure secure transmission of information to the Secretary of State; provide for destruction of records as required; and enable the Secretary of State to receive, view and collate information into individual electronic documents.
